- c) What does it mean to take someone or something for granted? Do you think it was unreasonable of Bee to feel upset in the first place?
- 2. Bee is embarrassed to hand out cookies to the neighbors and invite them to her mother's party. Instead, she hides them across the lake and lies about it.
- a) Why was Bee embarrassed? Why was it wrong of Bee to hide the cookies?
- b) What do the cookies represent / what are they a symbol of?
- c) Bee's actions hurt many people. What could Bee have done differently? What would you have done if you were in her shoes?
- 3. Bee's mom makes peach pickle for the party, but Bee steals a jar when she finds out that it can repel the eerie loons.
- a) Why did Bee's mom get upset when she found out Bee took a jar of her pickle?
- b) What are some things Bee could have done instead of taking the jar without asking?
- c) What is a family tradition of yours? Share with the class and explain its importance and what it means to you.

- 4. Lucas always wears blue goggles on his head and has his ginger cat named Albus perched on his shoulders.
- a) Why do you think he wears the goggles? What are the goggles a symbol of?
- b) Why do you think Lucas gives Bee his goggles at the end of the book?
- c) Who is Albus the cat really?
- 5. At the end of the story, Bee and her family have a celebration for Granny.
- a) What was the celebration about?
- b) Why do you think Bee was the only one who could see Granny?
- c) How does your family remember people/pets who have passed away? How are their memories honored?
- d) Why does Bee drop the bracelet into the fire? What was the bracelet a symbol of?



Losing a Loved One



- a) If you were in Bee's shoes, what are some actions you would have taken to stop Kitty from being a bully?
- b) Bullying is very dangerous. What are some things your school and classroom is doing to help prevent bullying and make you feel safe?
- c) What are some ways you could make someone new at school feel included?
- 7. When Bee first meets Lucas, she sees him running and somersaulting across the market, pretending to catch ghosts.
- a) Why does Bee not want to be Lucas' friend at first?
- b) How do you think that might have been hurtful to Lucas?
- c) How should Bee have acted instead?
- d) Who else does Bee judge by their appearance? Would the story have unfolded differently if she hadn't?
- 8. When Bee sees herself in the mirror above the fireplace in Alina's house, she sees the 'perfect' version of herself.
- a) Why does Bee wish she looked different? Why is it dangerous to want to change yourself to fit in?
- b) What does it mean to be your authentic self? What does it mean to be confident?
- c) What are some things your school and classroom is doing to make everyone feel safe to be themselves?
