


V2. If there were a general election tomorrow, and there were candidates from all political parties standing in your constituency, for which party would you vote?







Q3. The Conservative Party is currently deciding on a new leader Would you prefer the next leader of the Conservative Party to...






Q4. To what extent do you support or oppose energy generation from the following technologies?




Q5. To what extent do you support or oppose renewable energy projects in your local area?






Q6. Which of the following statements is closest to your view?




The Government has increased jobs and investment in offshore wind over the last five years




Q9. Which of the following is closest to your view?
