SHOEMAKER-LEVY CONVEYOR OVERPASS INSTALLATION

Temporary South Coast Highway closure TUESDAY MARCH 30TH, 6AM-6PM

On Tuesday, March 30th, First Quantum Minerals will take an important step for the future of Ravensthorpe Nickel Operation with the installation of a conveyor overpass across the South Coast Highway.

The South Coast Highway between Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Road and the Jerdacuttup Road will be closed for 12 hours to allow cranes to lift the final conveyor overpass span into place.

The overpass will connect the Shoemaker Levy mine to the processing plant on the south side of the road, bringing Ravensthorpe Nickel Operation one step closer to opening its brand-new pit.

The new mining pit is located on the northern side of the South Coast Highway, roughly 30km east of Ravensthorpe and 25km west of the Jerdacuttup Road turnoff.

Anyone travelling along the South Coast Highway between Ravensthorpe and Munglinup from 6:00am to 6:00pm will be required to take a detour on the Jerdacuttup

RNO and Main Roads are working together on finalising the necessary approvals for the conveyor overpass, and traffic controllers and signage will be stationed on the South Coast Hwy at the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe Road and Jerdacuttup Road turnoffs to direct road users.

The highway will be reopened after the installation has been successfully completed and final safety checks have been conducted.

First Quantum Minerals appreciates that the detour may cause inconvenience for road users and

apologises in advance for any additional travel time. The closure takes place during daylight hours to provide the safest possible conditions for the work crews involved.

An additional artistic element of the conveyor overpass will result in a unique tourist attraction for the region, forming part of First Quantum Minerals contribution to the local tourism sector and economy. The unique attraction will be instantly visible to locals and tourists once the road is reopened.

The installation of the conveyor overpass is essential to the long-term future of Ravensthorpe Nickel Operation and will enable the plant to keep producing and exporting nickel for at least another 20 years.

More details will be released to the media once the installation is complete.

Covid Vaccination clinic for the community

We were given the exciting news that the Ravensthorpe Medical Centre has been selected as a Covid Vaccination Hub and we currently will be the only vaccination hub between Esperance and Albany and all surrounding shires.

The Ravensthorpe site was chosen at a Federal level due to proximity to an Emergency Department and facilities to manage any problems encountered.

We have been advised that we should start to receive the vaccine on the week commencing April 12th.

We are eligible to receive 50 doses per week only, and we will be hosting a clinic once a week in Ravensthorpe, initially for people who are eligible for the 1b rollout.

Vaccine rollout

COVID-19 vaccines are being rolled out to people in phases, with those most at risk receiving their vaccinations first.

To find out if you are eligible to receive the vaccine now, visit https://covidvaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/eligibility and complete the COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Checker.

You can then make a booking to receive your vaccine.

Booking your appointment

COVID-19 vaccinations are voluntary and free.

When it is your turn to get vaccinated, you can call us on 9838 1600 Tuesdays and Thursdays or 9838 3854 Monday, Wednesday or Friday to book your appointments to get your first and second doses of the vaccine.

You can also book online www.livingstonmedical.com.au or come in to the Ravensthorpe and Hopetoun Clinics.

Make sure you book an appointment for your first and second doses. Please give us a call if you need to confirm what the timing should be between the appointments.

Preparing for your vaccination

Before your vaccination appointment, you should make sure your details are up to date with Medicare.

If you don't have your account set up, you can:

- enrol in Medicare, if you're not already enrolled.
- set up your Medicare online account if you're enrolled in Medicare, but don't have Medicare linked to myGov.
- get an Individual Health Identifier (IHI), if you're not eligible for Medicare

Please do not come to your vaccination appointment:

- if you are feeling unwell with fever, cough, runny nose or other symptoms that could be from COVID-19
- if you are waiting for COVID-19 test results, or have tested positive for COVID-19
- if you are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, or
- if you are in quarantine.

If you have had another vaccine, for example the influenza vaccination, in the 14 days before your COVID-19 vaccine appointment. Please let us know as we may need to reschedule your appointment.

To keep you and our community safe, before and after vaccination, it is important that you continue to:

- Stay 1.5 metres away from other people and avoid handshakes and contact with people outside your household.
- Stay home if you feel unwell and get tested for COVID-19. You must stay at home until your results come back.
- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water or use hand sanitiser.
- Always cough or sneeze into your arm or a tissue and put the tissue in the bin straight away.

New Ravy cultural precinct heads towards construction



Ravensthorpe locals are one step closer to getting their own state-of-the-art cultural precinct, with tenders for construction of the \$7 million project due to be issued in the coming weeks.

The 1,400sqm community hub has been designed to be a dynamic, safe, and inclusive space for residents and visitors of all ages. It will offer a range of activities and services, including a visitors centre, seniors and playgroup spaces, Community Resource Centre (CRC) and Council Chambers and reception.

The highly anticipated Cultural Precinct project was finally brought to reality through the generous support and contributions of 14 different business and community groups throughout the region, including a \$100k donation from Ravensthorpe Nickel Operation (RNO).

This support allowed the Shire to apply for a Building Better Regions Fund (BBRF) grant from the Australian Government, which they received.

The Centre will sit adjacent to the current Council buildings, and will take up 11,756sqm of town centre space including a large playground and public amphitheatre.

RNO Assistant General Manager Bob Gordon said RNO, like many other businesses in the region, was glad to support the Shire's plans to bring added vibrancy to the region.

"The Cultural Centre will bring real value to Ravensthorpe and the surrounding area. The community here is growing and their needs are changing, and it's pleasing to see the Shire of Ravensthorpe so committed to providing spaces that will be enjoyed by the whole community."

"We are proud to have played a role in bringing this project to life, and I look forward to visiting the Precinct once it opens", said Mr. Gordon.

The Cultural Centre will be constructed primarily from timber and will generate part of its' electricity from solar panels. A rainwater tank, energy-efficient lighting and low-energy building materials further contribute to reducing the building's environmental impact.

Shire of Ravensthorpe President Keith Dunlop said the precinct would provide a vital service and encourage social connection.

"We look forward to opening up a whole new range of opportunities for the region and to providing a space that is recognised as dynamic, safe and inclusive for all".

"The Council buildings are long overdue for a makeover, and the Shire has long been keen to provide healthy and fit-for-purpose offices spaces for our staff. This Precinct will go beyond that - it will be magnificent", said Mr. Dunlop.

It won't just be locals benefitting from the new Centre; tourism is also set to receive a boost, increasing economic activity throughout the region. The centre will serve as a modern and managed tourism facility for the whole region, increasing both time and dollars spent in Ravensthorpe and beyond.

What do the Volunteer Fire and Emergency Services do?

Volunteer Fire and Emergency Services (VFES) volunteers play a significant and vital role in helping to ensure their local communities are safe. VFES volunteers serve their local communities on a voluntary basis by undertaking both operational and non-operational roles. Not all VFES units are the same, volunteer roles and activities can vary depending on where you live.

The role of a VFES unit may vary and is determined by factors such as:

- the level of fire prevention and risk management required within their communities;
- the need to educate school children on fire safety;
- other community requirements.

VFES volunteers can respond to a range of local emergencies such as:

- structure, bush and scrub fires;
- hazardous materials emergencies;
- vehicle and industrial rescue;
- floods, storms and cyclones;
- cliff and cave rescues:
- land and air searches; and
- marine rescues.

What volunteer roles are available?

Volunteers undertake various roles according to their abilities, interests, and what they are comfortable with. The different volunteer roles are listed below.

- Firefighting
- Fire support
- Hazardous material recovery (HAZMAT)
- Road crash rescue
- Storm and flood response
- Search and Rescue
- Vertical rescue
- Radio communications
- Operations
- Logistics
- Administration
- Equipment maintenance
- Leadership
- Training
- Welfare




