Throughout the history of art, modern and contemporary artists have experimented with combining different materials in order to create something unique and unexpected in an endless number of ways. From Pablo Picasso's Still Life with Chair Caning, one of the earliest forms of collage in Western art, to Hannah Höch's politically driven photomontages to Wangechi Mutu's mixed media works focused on crucial women's issues-and countless others in between-artists have been pushing the boundaries of collage and exploring new mediums and techniques for decades.

Derived from the French verb coller, meaning "to glue," collage refers to both the technique and the resulting work of art in which fragments of paper and other materials are arranged and glued or otherwise affixed to a supporting surface.

This exhibition will feature a selection of contemporary artists who are exploring the rich breadth and history of collage through their own art. We are seeking artworks that explore the creative potential of collage and demonstrate innovative approaches to the medium. The gallery aims to include a selection of both formally trained artists and self-taught artists who have reinvented their chosen mediums. We will consider both 2D and 3D works of art that demonstrate each artist's unique vision and creative talent.

Preference will be given to artists living in Charlottesville, Virginia and the surrounding counties. However, artists outside of Virginia will be seriously

EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS:

Artists who are selected to participate will work with Executive Director and Chief Curator, Kristen Chiacchia in the months leading up to the exhibition to select artwork for inclusion in the gallery. Each artist should expect to showcase approximately 3-10 works in the exhibition. Work selected for the exhibition should have been created after 2019 and should not be shown in another gallery or art space within a 75 mile radius of Second Street Gallery in the 12 months leading up to this exhibition.

APPLICATION MATERIALS:

- Brief bio (150 words max)
- 3-5 artwork examples (this does not need to be work that you plan to include in the exhibition. However, it should at least be representative of the type of work that you will include in the exhibition.) Images should be JPG format and no larger than 1Mb. Image filename should be: ARTISTNAME_TITLE_YEAR_MEDIUM_ DIMENSIONS.jpg (if the filenames are not labeled properly, the application may be considered incomplete).
