ON THE ISSUES

Gun Violence Prevention

- Voted for the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, which would protect schools and communities from gun violence
- Voted in support of the Protecting Our Kids Act, which would strengthen gun storage requirements and make other common sense gun safety improvements

Environment

- Fought to protect areas like the Grand Canyon from industry exploitation
- Championed partnerships with Tribal governments
- Introduced legislation to protect water resources in Arizona

Reproductive Rights

- Voted for Right to Contraception Act and Women's Health Protection Act of 2022

VOTING INFORMATION

REGISTERING TO VOTE OR UPDATING YOUR VOTING INFORMATION:

You have several options to register to vote in Arizona

Online: If you have an Arizona Driver's License and/or an Arizona non-operating I.D. card issued by the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) you may register to vote through Service Arizona EZ Voter Registration at servicearizona.com

By Mail: You can either print off a form online (PDF) from azsos.org or request that a registration form be mailed to you from your County Recorder. After completing the voter registration form, mail it to your county recorder's office.

In Person: You may visit your County Recorder's Office and fill out a registration form in person.

After you have successfully registered to vote you will receive a voter registration card in the mail within 4-6 weeks.

DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE OR UPDATE VOTING INFORMATION: **July 1, 2024**

DEADLINE TO REGISTER TO RECEIVE A MAIL-IN BALLOT: **July 19, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.**

YOUR BALLOT MUST BE RECEIVED BY 7 PM ON ELECTION DAY

DUE TO POSSIBLE DELAYS WITH THE USPS VOTERS SHOULD REQUEST AND RETURN THEIR VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT IT ARRIVES ON TIME

VOTING BY MAIL:

All Arizonians can register to vote by mail. There are two vote-by-mail options:

Join the *Active Early Voting List* to be automatically sent a ballot-by-mail for all elections

OR

Sign up to get a *one-time* ballot-by-mail

To receive a mail-in ballot, you can submit a form online or by print out and mail in a physical form. Visit servicearizona.com for more information.

VOTING EARLY:

Early in-person voting begins on **July 3rd** and will run through **July 26th**.

Each county has their own early in-person voting arrangements.

Please contact your county recorder's office or visit azsos.gov/county-election-info for more details.

VOTING AT THE POLLS:

Voters must vote at the assigned polling place. To find your polling place visit: my.arizona.vote

Voters who received a vote-by-mail ballot will have to cast a provisional ballot at the polls.

You must bring a valid photo I.D. such as a driver's license or a tribal I.D. to vote. Find the full list of acceptable identification at azsos.gov
