CEO & Board Chair Message

The 2017-2018 year has seen the YMCA of Medicine Hat continue to evolve and diversify. With the changing marketplace, competitive landscape and legislative environment, YMCAs across the country face challenges like never before. While working hard to continue providing a quality HFA (health, fitness and aquatics) experience, YMCAs must also look outward to focus on their local community impact. This was our main priority over the last year and as you can see from the information in this report, the rewards of our hard work are exciting.

YMCAs are the largest provider of child care services in the country. We are very pleased to share our local accomplishments in this area over the past year. In addition to new early years funding that allowed us to cap parent fees at \$25 a day, we also expanded into out of school care. These two initiatives increased our total child care spaces by over 400% and our staff body by approximately 60%.

Similarly, our Employment Centre saw major expansion in both Medicine Hat and Brooks which was made possible with the addition of three new funding contracts. We are very proud of our ability to create significant impact in both of these communities through the provision of high-quality employment services designed to get Albertans back into the workforce.

We recognize that there are still challenges ahead of us as we continue to modernize the way our YMCA operates. As we reflect on the successes of the past year, we look forward to 2018-2019 as a time of renewed engagement with our members to ensure that our HFA programs and services provide the level of quality individuals and families within our community have come to expect.

Thank you for your continued support on our journey to promote a healthy community, foster belonging and connection and help children and families thrive.

Early Years Child Care

NEW! Both YMCA child development centres were selected to receive Early Learning Child Care funding from the Government of Alberta which caps parent fees at \$25/day and provides employee wage floor increases, professional development opportunities and enhanced curriculum.

We added $\frac{2}{2}$ new child care spaces to meet the growing demand in the community. (Total = 115)



Introduction to the Trades **Integrated Training Program** (Medicine Hat)

Funded through Alberta Labour, in partnership with the Medicine Hat College, the YMCA Employment Centre – Medicine Hat recruits and selects students to enter this program.

12 participants attended weekly life management and employability workshops over a 22-week period.



Professional Sales Integrated Training Program (Medicine Hat)





Get Active

Changes in physical literacy scores at the start of the school year/program vs the end of the school year/program:



Avg Improvement: 133%

While this seems like a big jump from the previous 2 years' data showing a 40% improvement, there are a few reasons why:

- ✓ More experienced staff doing the testing
- ✓ Testing being done more consistently
- Programming planned out with schools in a more coordinated fashion, being offered with a larger focus on fundamental movement skills
- ✓ Targeting the areas that have lower scores at the start of the year
- Kids in program that have taken it for 3+ years now





Early Intervention Program for Young Mothers

- **12** program participants
- 6 healthy, full term babies born to participants
- **5** participants graduated in June 2018

Child Minding at the YMCA

Available at the Downtown and South Ridge locations

Offers parents the opportunity to utilize YMCA programs and services while their children enjoy a safe, interactive and fun environment.

Available for children ages 0 -9.

Non-licensed, however follows YMCA standards that are consistent across the country.

YMCA ratios of

1:4 for children 0-12 months; **1:6** for 13 months – 4 years; **1:8** for 5+

Expanded to meet the growing demand Downtown!

Child Minding in our facilities averaged 569 children per month.

Our prior location was a small room that was often overcrowded (at our peak times we have as many as 30 children in the room)

New area provides more space for children to:

- Play safely in different age groupings
- Experience age appropriate YMCA programming based on the national early years' Playing to Learn curriculum
- To have easy access to supervised a washroom and water fountain located in the same room

Overall total member was stationary with a slight decrease of _5%


