CEO & Board Chair Message

We are so proud of the YMCA's accomplishments over the last year. Adjusting to a new post-pandemic/endemic normal has been a challenge and the information in this report is testament to the dedication and commitment of the YMCA employees and volunteers who made it possible. There is a saying within the YMCA federation: in times of trouble the Y steps up. This wisdom has guided the organization throughout the pandemic and is reflected in our program expansion to better meet the evolving needs of the communities we serve.

Many people do not realize the scope of everything the YMCA of Medicine Hat does. As a charity, we currently operate out of 17 separate locations, touching the lives of over 10,000 people each year. With programs in Medicine Hat and Brooks, the YMCA has between 120-200 employees, depending on the time of year. We have nearly doubled in size and community impact over the last 6 years, and we are still growing!

2021-2022 saw the innovative pilot of Camp Jude, a specialized day camp designed to meet the needs of children who have experienced trauma. Thanks to a grant from the YMCA Canada Innovation Fund, Camp Jude provided a safe and fulfilling experience for children who would not have been successful in traditional day camp settings. Our learnings from this pilot will be shared with YMCAs across Canada to facilitate the development of similar programs in their communities.

We also launched an Alternative Suspension Program this year. This program works directly with youth who have been suspended from school to address the reasons that contributed to the suspension. The goal is to reduce and/or prevent future suspensions, while building resiliency to ensure youth have the coping skills necessary to navigate life's challenges.

YMCA Employment Services continued to grow over the past year too. With the addition of 2 new programs, any Albertan aged 15+ can walk through our doors in Medicine Hat and/or Brooks and receive help finding a job. Local employers also benefit from our services through access to subsidized work placements to supplement their labour force.

The John Millar and Crescent Heights Child Development Centres both underwent capital improvements this year, thanks to a grant from the Government of Alberta. This funding resulted in an additional 15 new licensed childcare spaces for the community. In addition to renovated interior space, both centres received playground and program equipment upgrades too. Professional development was prioritized with Educators receiving training on inclusion, intercultural awareness, and accessibility.

Throughout the year, YMCA Before & After School Care Programs provided safe, high-quality care to school aged children. During school breaks, licensed community day camps were offered as an affordable option for families in need of childcare. Funding from United Way of South Eastern Alberta ensured licensed community summer day camps were subsidized and offered at a reduced rate for all families.

Several capital improvements at the Downtown and South Ridge branches were facilitated through the acquisition of grant funding. This included new pieces of fitness equipment, flooring, paint, meeting room furniture, etc. Many improvements


also occurred behind the scenes on our roofs, in our mechanical rooms, and on our HVAC units. Although these improvements are not visible to gym members, they are all very necessary to ensure our buildings operate safely and effectively.

The Claim Your Name capital fundraising campaign for the Downtown YMCA provided us with further assistance to complete capital improvements. Sun City Dental's sponsorship saw a full refresh of the Men's Health Plus Club. A donation from the Miller family allowed us to complete upgrades in the pool area which included interior roof repairs, fresh paint, and window repairs, with more upgrades planned in the upcoming year. The purchase of new bleachers provides space for families to watch their children's swimming lessons. The Kinsmen Club of Medicine Hat also provided sponsorship to convert the lobby washrooms into a fully accessible and inclusive space. Stay tuned for those upgrades in 2023!

As we move forward into 2022-2023, we look forward to opening the Y on 2nd (525 2nd Street SE, Medicine Hat). To honor the legacy of Camp Elkwater, proceeds from its sale were rolled over into this building that will eventually house the YMCA's administrative offices and community programs. This is an area of growth for us, and we are excited to announce that this building will be home to even more new community programs in the upcoming year.

None of this work would be possible without the hard work of YMCA employees and volunteers. Kudos to the frontline staff who greet our gym members, childcare families, and program participants. Thank you to the management team for supporting the front line and ensuring our programs run smoothly. Hats off to the volunteers who give their time, talent, and treasure to support our governance (Board of Directors), events, fitness programs, and gym member engagement. Finally, thanks to the senior leadership team for providing the foundation for the organization to achieve its mission. Every person plays an interconnected role in the YMCA's success, and our success directly translates into community impact.

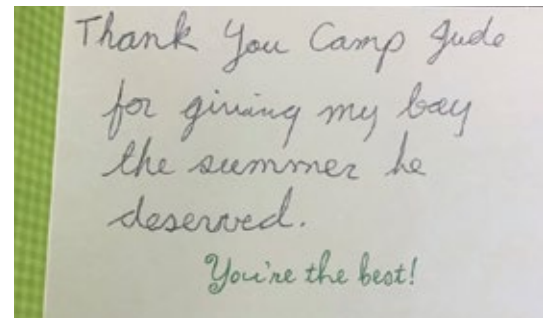
Camp Jude

This summer we launched Camp Jude, an innovative trauma-informed day camp specifically designed to support children ages 5-12 who would otherwise be unable to attend traditional summer programming.

Camp Jude was made possible through YMCA Canada's Innovation Grant, which provided \$50,000 to pilot the program in Medicine Hat. The YMCA will share its learnings nationally in hopes that other YMCAs across the country will offer similar trauma-informed day camps in their communities.

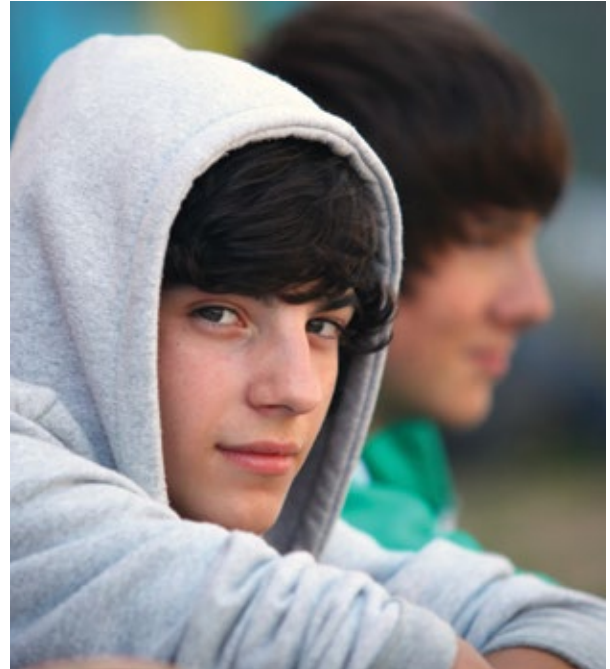

Alternative Suspension

The YMCA introduced the Alternative Suspension program to our community in March. With a proven 20-year track record in Quebec YMCAs, this program aims to reduce future suspensions by offering participants an opportunity to turn their time away from school into a positive experience that encourages personal growth, the development of social skills, and autonomy.

Summer Aides

The Summer Aides program launched in 2021. Funded by the Government of Alberta to serve children in care, this program provides one-to-one workers for children and youth who require additional support to participate in summer programs throughout the community. This gives children the opportunity to attend summer camps, youth programs and gain valuable life skills.

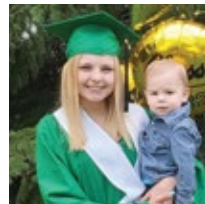

Designed to assist adults in finding employment through job search assistance, employability skills training, job maintenance skills building, and resolution of barriers to employment.

Designed for adults who need help acquiring additional skills to find employment quickly. Participants can access up to \$7,000 worth of training required to enter their career of choice. This contract commenced in June at the Medicine Hat Employment Centre.

YMCA Employment Centre Hiring Events

Continuing with funding received in 2020 through Alberta's Labour Market Partnership Program, 2 Drive-Thru Recruitment Events were held in September 2021. Organized collaboratively with the Medicine Hat College, local Government of Alberta Community/Social Services and Labour/Immigration departments, these events offered employers an innovative format to find employees during COVID-19 public health restrictions.

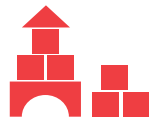

We created more space.



The Crescent Heights and John Millar Development Centre were the recipients of a Space Creation grant from the Government of Alberta. These funds covered renovations to existing space to open 15 additional childcare spaces for the community. Funding also improved accessibility with the installation of artificial turf, accessible play structures, calming cubes, risky play opportunities and messy play experiences. The grant allowed us to increase educator capacity through community partnerships, training, and professional development. Educators increased their knowledge and understanding of outdoor learning, childhood anxiety, challenging behaviors, cultural sensitivity, and inclusion within the classroom setting.



We found ways to keep costs low for families.



John Millar and Crescent Heights Child Development Centres received a Transition Grant from the Government of Alberta to assist families with the move from the Government's Early Learning & Child Care \$25/day pilot program back to market rates. This funding saved families approximately \$184,000.



Families like the Deveauxs

As first-time parents, Chris and I were very apprehensive about childcare. We weren't ready to pass our girl off just yet. However, I was soon due back to work so the search began.

We viewed multiple day homes but could not seem to find one that we were comfortable with. I set up an appointment at the YMCA Crescent Heights Child Development Centre. I wasn't thrilled about a daycare centre because I didn't think Kitty would get the attention she needed in a larger facility compared to a private small day home. I came to learn I was very wrong.

Esmeralda met me for my viewing, and she was wonderful, pleasant, polite, and knowledgeable. As she walked me through the building my feelings about a larger facility began to change. Dozens of cubbies lined the hallways. Each filled with personal possessions. Polka dot rubber boots, dinosaur coats and tiny back packs. Colorful classrooms with kid's paintings on the walls, sensory bins, and toys. The room seemed to say, "Come in and play!" Then I was taken outside. Individual green spaces for each age group. Loads of toys to climb on, slides, pots to bang on, a little kid's dream.

I was so pleased. It really looked like everything we were searching for. The tour was ending when this little blonde boy came running down the hallway with the widest smile and even wider arms. He wrapped them tightly around the leg of a staff member. It was so heartwarming to see the connection they had. Both were genuinely happy to be there. That was it I was sold. I called Chris and said, "The search is over, we found a daycare."

Kitty loves her daycare. She can barely contain her excitement as we pull into the parking lot in the morning to drop her off. The relationships that she has formed with all the staff are beautiful. Her little face lights up as we pass her over for the day. She is always greeted with a welcoming hug. Shannon, Ed, and Holly are truly amazing. Miss Rhona holds a special place in Kitty's heart, and they have a unique bond. Kitty adores her. Everyone treats Kitty as if she was their own child. They truly care about her and her wellbeing. It is the perfect environment for children to learn, grow and thrive in. Our experience has been nothing but positive. We are looking forward to watching the further development of our sweet girl. Thank you all for your continuous love and support. We cannot tell you enough how appreciated you are.

The United Way South Eastern Alberta awarded the YMCA of Medicine Hat \$30,000 from their Steve Murphy Foundation to directly offset the cost of Licensed Summer Day Camps and PD Day Camps. As a result of this funding, families saved 33% on registration fees, paying only \$150 per week for YMCA Summer Community Camps.

With this funding, the YMCA was able to offer the most affordable day camp option within the city this summer. This funding also allowed the program to take campers on exciting field trips, like Dunmore Dugout. Families also saw savings in PD Day Camps throughout the funding period, with fees lowered to \$40/day.

The Miller family's generosity allowed us to upgrade the pool area with bleachers for additional seating, roof repairs, and painting. Upgrades in the Men's Health Plus Club were completed thanks to sponsorship from Sun City Dental. In August, the Kinsmen Club of Medicine Hat announced a sponsorship of \$105,000 that will create inclusive washrooms off the lobby in 2023 and assist with upgrading technology in meeting rooms to allow the YMCA to offer programs virtually.

"In September 2020 I had a mild stroke which affected my right side. While I was in the hospital (which looking back was a good thing) my condition deteriorated. I had come down with necrotizing pancreatitis and compartment syndrome of the stomach. I was flown to Calgary, and with the help of the hospital staff I started taking baby steps to begin my recovery. After my release in December 2020 and a physio program, I was introduced to Jen with the Living Fit Program. Jen helped me get ready to return to work, which was a very long and difficult process. I had lost all my strength and 98% of my mobility. I was trying to teach myself how to do almost everything again. With Jen's knowledge and the support of my wife and kids, I returned to work in August 2021. Now, just over a year later, I am about 70% strength back and about 80% mobility. If not for Jen and her program she built for me and all the staff at the Medicine Hat Hospital, South Health Campus, Foothills Hospital, and the Peter Lougheed Centre I would not have made it this far. My new goal is the Rattler Run this Spring.... not bad for a guy that was told he may never walk again."

We provided inclusive opportunities.

"You see, I work with special needs children. I was looking for a place to bring children that would support inclusion. The staff worked with me to be sure we had everything we needed to feel like we belonged there. They gave us encouragement to try new things. When those things proved to be hard or scary, they showed us another way, and even sometimes a better way. Through the many classes offered, I was able to find something to fit everyone's needs. We built confidence with support and encouragement, connections through comradery and common goals, and a sense of self through perseverance and pride in accomplishment. The Y helped us build connections with peers and fostered a sense of being a part of something bigger. We were able to explore our abilities without judgement or criticism. We could show what we were able to do without fear of ridicule for things we struggled with. We built on our strengths and overcame some big hurdles. We developed connections which built confidence that led to stronger social skills. The Y gave us a chance to lift each other up and become a better version of who we were. The Y helped us develop the building blocks we need to build a better tomorrow."
