Emory Healthcare is proud to provide athletic training services to the Lakeside High School athletic program. As the athletic trainer assigned to Lakeside High School, it is my goal to collaborate with administrative and coaching staff to ensure safety precautions and emergency plans are implemented, provide immediate medical care during practices and sporting events, evaluate and assess injuries, and advise athletes, coaches, and parents on return to participation practices.

Dekalb County Schools utilizes an athlete electronic medical record system called DragonFly Max, which will allow coaches and medical providers the ability to collectively access the required GHSA documents needed for sport participation. It also acts as a medical record system to document injuries and treatment for each individual athlete. Information used in your child's DragonFly Max account is kept on a HIPAA and FERPA compliant server providing secure storage of personal and medical information.

DragonFly Max accounts can be created at www.dragonflymax.com or by downloading the DragonFly Max App on a smartphone. Once an account is created, athlete profiles will be updated annually. Follow instructions on the attached handout to upload physical forms and electronically sign GHSA required documents. For those with existing Dragonfly Max accounts, simply sign in and update forms for the current school year. There is no need to create a new account.
