Many of their graduates complete diplomas or GEDs after age 19 due to the effects of unstable family situations and homelessness. MIKE, along with a small team of dedicated mentors, provides health education programming for students to explore health information, physical activity and nutrition, stress management and mental health, opportunities for careers in healthcare and much more.

Sweet Home Students Explore Human Body at Western University

Inspired by last year's success, 23 medical students at Western University of Health Sciences (WUHS) are volunteering to be mentors for MIKE at Sweet Home High School (SHHS) this year. They began with an introductory session at SHHS in early October, then hosted a compelling tour of the WUHS campus and Anatomy Lab a few weeks ago. The medical students served as station hosts to guide their younger peers through many facets of the human body. Three-guarters of the SHHS students reported that they thought the visit was fascinating, 68% said it helped them understand more about the lives of medical students and 58% said it helped them understand anatomy more. More than half of the SHHS students said they were interested in a career in healthcare because of their experience with the WUHS students.

SHHS student Keeley shared, "The medical students were very caring and sweet, they kept on making sure I was okay, and what I learned was amazing." Sam commented, "I learned a lot more about the human nervous system and found that aspect really interesting. I didn't know that spinal fluid was created in the brain, and it gave me a lot of insight into some medical problems I have heard of lately that I didn't understand." And Colin added, "It was interesting to really see how the human body functioned without looking at a computer screen or a book and getting the real thing." MIKE mentors also hosted other activities for students to explore on campus.
