
A new year – and we fight on !

At the start of a new year, we at Save West of Ifield would like to take this opportunity to reflect a little on the past year and to **THANK YOU ALL** for the support you've given.

Over the past year SWOI have been working hard raising awareness, researching and drafting our responses to Horsham's forthcoming Local Plan, and fundraising. We've recruited several professional consultants, established a close working relationship with Rusper Parish Council, and through your generosity and monies budgeted by Rusper Parish Council for mutually beneficial projects, we've raised and secured access to £30,000!!!! Fantastic in one year of fundraising. Thank you all so much.

You've been hard at it too, writing to Horsham Council and the papers, responding to Homes England consultations, attending our fundraising events and helping to spread the word.

So many of you have been so generous with your donations, support, time, and knowledge. We can't give everyone a name-check but we will say thank you to the Ifield Society, Ifield Village Conservation Area Advisory Committee, Ifield Cricket Club, The Plough and Attic Rooms, Rusper, The Plough, Ifield (our unofficial Head Office), and St Margaret's Church.



The battle continues. Horsham may have delayed their local plan, but we're still expecting it to be published this year, possibly followed by an outline planning application from Homes England, so please keep up the pressure. Keep writing to Horsham Council and the papers with your thoughts on West of Ifield being allocated in the Local Plan. 
Call for Cash!

We welcome this delay because we think more time is needed to consider the potential benefits of Michael Gove's recent

statements around modifying housebuilding targets. And other local authorities agree – at least 15 have paused their Local Plans for exactly this reason.

We do understand however that the Plan's delay could open the door to speculative planning applications from developers, but without more information it's impossible for us to form a view on how serious this threat is and the likelihood of a six month delay making a material difference, particularly given the constraints imposed by water neutrality.

Also on the plus side, given the inadequate consultation so far, this delay presents a real opportunity to ensure that residents fully understand the scale and potential impact of a new 10,000 house development between Crawley and Horsham.

Horsham Council's May elections also provide an opportunity to elect a council that most represents the views of residents.
