Lee Bethel

Taught by Time

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Lee Bethel *TAUGHT BY TIME* launches the Egg & Dart's roster of solo exhibitions at a new address in central Wollongong.

TAUGHT BY TIME ventures into a bigger format yet sustains Lee Bethel's dedication to paper as a magically structural material. Her works suggest an infinite expanse and reveal how small changes make a vast difference when applied across a surface. This can occur in the shifting angle at which paper is applied or the turn of a curve as it repeats and stratifies.

Encaustic is wax and when applied to paper it builds dimension and lets the light in. The density of wax allows for translucent textured surfaces. With its long history as an art material, it brings resilience to Lee Bethel's work with paper. This current show in particular holds close to a feeling of transparency. Lee notes, "*Transparency fosters exploration. You can look through and see tonal changes and then colour on the underside of paper as seen through wax. What happens to colour when it is pushed through this many layers?*"

Lee Bethel introduces colour through what she describes as "reflective watercolour applied to the back of the paper so it will reflect on whatever is underneath. Depending on the light, you see a glow of colour. The light gets strong and you get more of it, otherwise it fades away." In other recent works, colour can be seen beneath intricately cut paper layers which form windows to the softest of tinted surfaces below. The abstract balances with the poetic through titles that reference Emily Dickinson. Bethel regards Dickinson's poems as "succinct in their language but wide in the vision she gives you from that language". The titles tend to arrive after the work is finished, when the artist considers something in the writing that connects. It is the same poetic turn that emerges in the waves and folds that form through Lee Bethel's contemplative practice.

Accretion, increment and accumulation. Lee Bethel uses paper with the resolve of relief sculpture. The works are rich and tactile, and revelatory in their material qualities. *TAUGHT BY TIME* expands the scale of Lee Bethel's ongoing investigation into the capacities of paper. To explore this, the viewer is invited to move around the new gallery space and locate the angles where colour reflects and the light passes through.

In the first half of this year, Lee Bethel has been a finalist in the Hazelhurst Art on Paper Prize, the Flow Contemporary Watercolour Prize and the Grace Cossington Smith Art Prize. Her work has also also been shown in Victoria as a finalist in the Banyule Award for Works on Paper and the Biblio Art Prize. Bethel has had solo exhibitions at the Hazelhurst, Shoalhaven and Bathurst Regional Galleries and her work is held in the Wollongong City Gallery Permanent Collection.
