Judges Choice - Novice - Rlc. Taiwan Chief Wine

An orchid hybrid by 'Chief Orchid Nursery' in 2013.

It is a cross of Rlc. Village Chief Tearoom x Rlc. Sunstate Colorchart.

Grown on a bench on the western side of the house located under the protection of a tree. This allows the plant to get around 1 hour of direct sunlight in the morning before the dappled light.

The tabled plant demonstrates a common error for the novice grower, in that it has been potted up into container that is too large. A common outcome of using a container that is too large is that the potting media retains too much moisture, and the roots rot. **Dean & Rosanna**

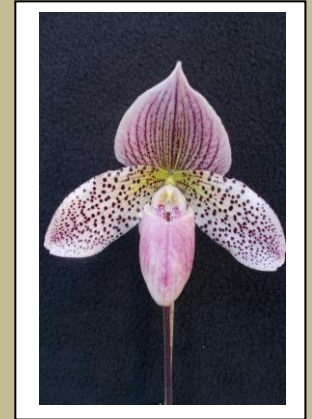
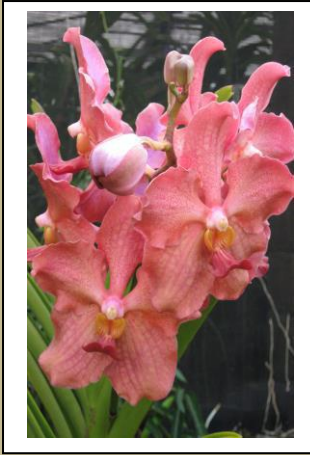
