

LEARN TO LIMERICK WITH LOU

A limerick is a short, funny poem that's like a tiny song made out of words! It has five lines that follow a special pattern.

Making a limerick is fun and easy! Here's how to do it in a few simple steps:

Step 1: Count Your Lines

A limerick has five lines. Remember this pattern: the first, second, and fifth lines rhyme with each other, and the third and fourth lines rhyme with each other.

Step 2: Get the Rhythm Right

Make sure the first, second, and fifth lines have about the same length and rhythm. The third and fourth lines should be shorter and also match each other in length and rhythm.

Step 3: Start with Something Funny

Begin your limerick with a funny idea or character. This makes it enjoyable!

Step 4: Build a Little Story

Use the middle lines to add details or a twist to your story.

Step 5: Finish with a Punchline

End with a funny or surprising last line that makes everyone laugh.
