There are too many distortions for us to address in one letter, but I do want you to know that guaranteed income works - I've seen its effects firsthand.

Guaranteed income is not a "socialist experiment," as you call it in your petition. In fact, it's been supported by conservatives like economist Milton Friedman and President Richard Nixon, whose Family Assistance Plan in 1969 would have provided a minimum income to poor families across America. Nor is the idea new or radical. The United States has a long history of using cash transfers to address financial hardship, from Social Security payments to child tax credits, earned income tax credits, and unemployment insurance. Guaranteed income is simply the continuation of a common-sense approach to supporting community financial stability that is reflected in America's most effective and popular government programs.

You argue that "Harris County has neither received nor will receive any return benefit" from the Harris County guaranteed income program. Did you not see the results from the Expanded Child Tax Credit in 2021, which provided direct, recurring cash payments to families across the country with no strings attached - also known as a guaranteed income? The Expanded Child Tax Credit reached more than 35 million households with children, cutting child poverty by nearly half and driving it to record lows, including across all racial and ethnic groups measured. It also reduced food insecurity among families by 26% and led to the lowest share of households with children that were food insecure on record. Studies of the program also found that employment rates did not decline, contrary to a popular yet false trope. Overall, researchers found that the Expanded Child Tax Credit resulted in ten times the return on investment.

As opposed to the unsubstantiated talking points you use throughout your petition, we have more facts to back up our case that guaranteed income works. Mayors and Counties for a Guaranteed Income has supported over 60 guaranteed income pilots across the country. In total, these pilots will deliver at least \$250 million in direct, unconditional relief to everyday Americans.

Research on guaranteed income pilots shows that when given unrestricted payments, recipients are able to rise above the barriers of poverty and create economic stability for themselves, their families, and their communities. When I was Mayor of Stockton, I implemented the nation's first mayor-led guaranteed income program, the Stockton Economic Empowerment Demonstration (SEED). A study conducted by independent researchers determined that full-time employment rose, from 28% to 40%, among residents who received the guaranteed income, and their financial, physical and emotional health all improved.

Tomas Vargas, Jr., one of the recipients of SEED's \$500 per month guaranteed income, is an exemplar of the impact of this type of program. Before SEED, he was juggling multiple jobs: working part-time at UPS, repairing cars, mowing lawns, delivering groceries and picking up any other work he could find. He almost never saw his children. His family briefly received food stamp assistance, but when he managed to pick up extra hours at work, they lost that line of support. The guaranteed income payments helped Tomas apply for one full-time job, something he had never been able to do because he couldn't afford to take a day off work to interview. The extra financial security allowed him to spend more time with his children, and ultimately break the cycle of poverty he had seen in his community his whole life.

Independent research studies on pilots in <u>Cambridge, MA</u> and <u>Saint Paul, MN</u> have also found an increase in employment rates. Recipients in Saint Paul reported greater levels of mental and physical health. Studies of Cambridge's program also found increased time and space for parenting, and better educational outcomes for children. <u>Paterson, NJ</u>'s pilot program resulted in a rise in self-employment and higher incomes among participants from baseline and when compared to a control group. Virtually all programs have resulted in increased financial stability and the ability to afford a \$500 cash emergency, such as an unexpected car repair or a broken appliance.

Americans are struggling, and many families are only partially covered by, or completely left out of, existing social safety net programs. Harris County residents experience higher rates of poverty than other large counties, not only in Texas but across the nation, with 1 in 6 people living in poverty. A guaranteed income allows families to use the monthly checks for their pressing needs, rather than the government deciding what people need. With poverty rates skyrocketing while the cost of living continues to increase, guaranteed income programs serve as vital lifelines for millions of American families.

I encourage you to reconsider your approach and look at the facts about what Harris County is trying to achieve. Guaranteed income works - providing a hand up, not a hand out, to Texas's most vulnerable.

As Co-Chair of Mayors for a Guaranteed Income—an organization representing over 190 current and former local elected officials from across the United States—I am urging you to allow Harris County to continue its pursuit of a guaranteed income for low-income residents. We have independent evaluation that tells us that guaranteed income works—and I've seen its effects firsthand.

As Mayor of Saint Paul, I launched the nation's first guaranteed income pilot to leverage public funds. Our People's Prosperity Pilot provided 150 residents with babies with \$500 a month for up to 18 months. An independent evaluation of the program found profound effects, with the number of people employed increasing from 49% at the beginning of the pilot to 63% six months after the program ended. Recipients showed fewer symptoms of anxiety or depression and better health overall. Researchers also found that recipients had greater food security, transitioned into better housing, felt a greater sense of hopefulness, and showed other indicators of well-being and quality of life.

What we saw in Saint Paul tracks with what we've seen in other guaranteed income studies. Independent research studies on pilots in <u>Stockton, CA</u> and <u>Cambridge, MA</u> also found an increase in employment rates. <u>Paterson, NJ</u>'s pilot program resulted in a rise in self-employment and higher incomes among participants from baseline and when compared to a control group. Recipients in Stockton also reported greater levels of mental and physical health. Studies of Cambridge's program found increased time and space for parenting, and better educational outcomes for children. Virtually all programs have resulted in increased financial stability and the ability to afford a \$500 cash emergency, such as an unexpected car repair or a broken appliance.

All of this aligns with the results from the Expanded Child Tax Credit in 2021, which provided direct, recurring cash payments to families across the country with no strings attached—also known as a guaranteed income. The Expanded Child Tax Credit reached more than 35 million households with children, cutting child poverty by nearly half and driving it to record lows, including across all racial and ethnic groups measured. It also reduced food insecurity among families by 26% and led to the lowest share on record of households with children that were food insecure. Studies of the program also found that employment rates did not decline, contrary to a popular yet false trope. Dear Attorney General Paxton:

As Co-Chair of Counties for a Guaranteed Income, I am writing to express my strong support for programs that offer unconditional cash assistance to low-income residents, often referred to as Guaranteed Income. I am concerned about your efforts to block Harris County's innovative guaranteed income program, Uplift Harris. Counties for a Guaranteed Income, together with our sister organization Mayors for a Guaranteed Income, represents over 190 current and former local elected officials from across the United States. Our coalition has supported over 60 guaranteed income pilots across the country, and what we've seen over and over again is that guaranteed income works.

Struggling families need our support – with the cost of living continuing to rise, families are left with choosing between paying rent and putting food on the table. Workers have to work 2 or 3 jobs yet still do not have the resources to rise out of poverty. Guaranteed income is not a "socialist experiment," as you call it in your petition. In fact, it's been supported by conservatives like economist Milton Friedman and President Richard Nixon, whose Family Assistance Plan in 1969 would have provided a minimum income to poor families across America. The United States has a long history of using cash transfers to address financial hardship, from Social Security payments to child tax credits, earned income tax credits, and unemployment insurance. Guaranteed income is simply the continuation of a common-sense approach to supporting community financial stability that is reflected in America's most effective and popular government programs.

I championed guaranteed income in Los Angeles County, launching the largest pilot program in the nation. BREATHE is giving 1,200 county residents \$1,000 per month for 3 years. There are no strings on this cash because we believe that the people enduring financial instability are best positioned to make decisions that efficiently address their household's needs — whether paying for rent, a new tire, or an unexpected trip to urgent care.



While I was Mayor of Cambridge, we started a pilot that provided 130 single care takers with \$500 monthly for 18 months. This program was a lottery program and not everyone who applied received the funds. Single parent households with children 18 or under who earned at or below 80% Area Median Income were eligible. Applicants were chosen randomly. We ensured all participants received benefit waivers so that families didn't lose other benefits now that they would be receiving \$500 monthly.

This program has been a lifeline for residents and recipients have been able to go back to school to enhance their skills, regain employment, pay off most of their credit debts, enroll their children in extracurricular activities, and pay for groceries and avoid waiting in food pantry lines.

Independent research studies on our pilot in <u>Cambridge</u>, <u>MA</u> and in <u>Saint Paul</u>, <u>MN</u> also found an increase in employment rates. Recipients in Saint Paul reported greater levels of mental and physical health. Our Cambridge program also found increased time and space for parenting, and better educational outcomes for children. <u>Paterson</u>, <u>NJ</u>'s pilot program resulted in a rise in self-employment and higher incomes among participants from baseline and when compared to a control group. Virtually all programs have resulted in increased financial stability and the ability to afford a \$500 cash emergency, such as an unexpected car repair or a broken appliance.

Since then, I have expanded our pilot to nearly 2,000 families. Any family living at or below the 250% poverty line with a child was eligible to receive \$500 monthly for 18 months. We used \$22 million from Cambridge's American Rescue Plan funds to initiate this expansion to our residents in need.

Americans are struggling, and many families are only partially covered by, or completely left out of, existing social safety net programs. Harris County residents experience higher rates of poverty than other large counties, not only in Texas but across the nation, with 1 in 6 people living in



poverty. A guaranteed income allows families to use the monthly checks for their pressing needs, rather than the government deciding what people need. With poverty rates skyrocketing while the cost of living continues to increase, guaranteed income programs serve as vital lifelines for millions of American families.
