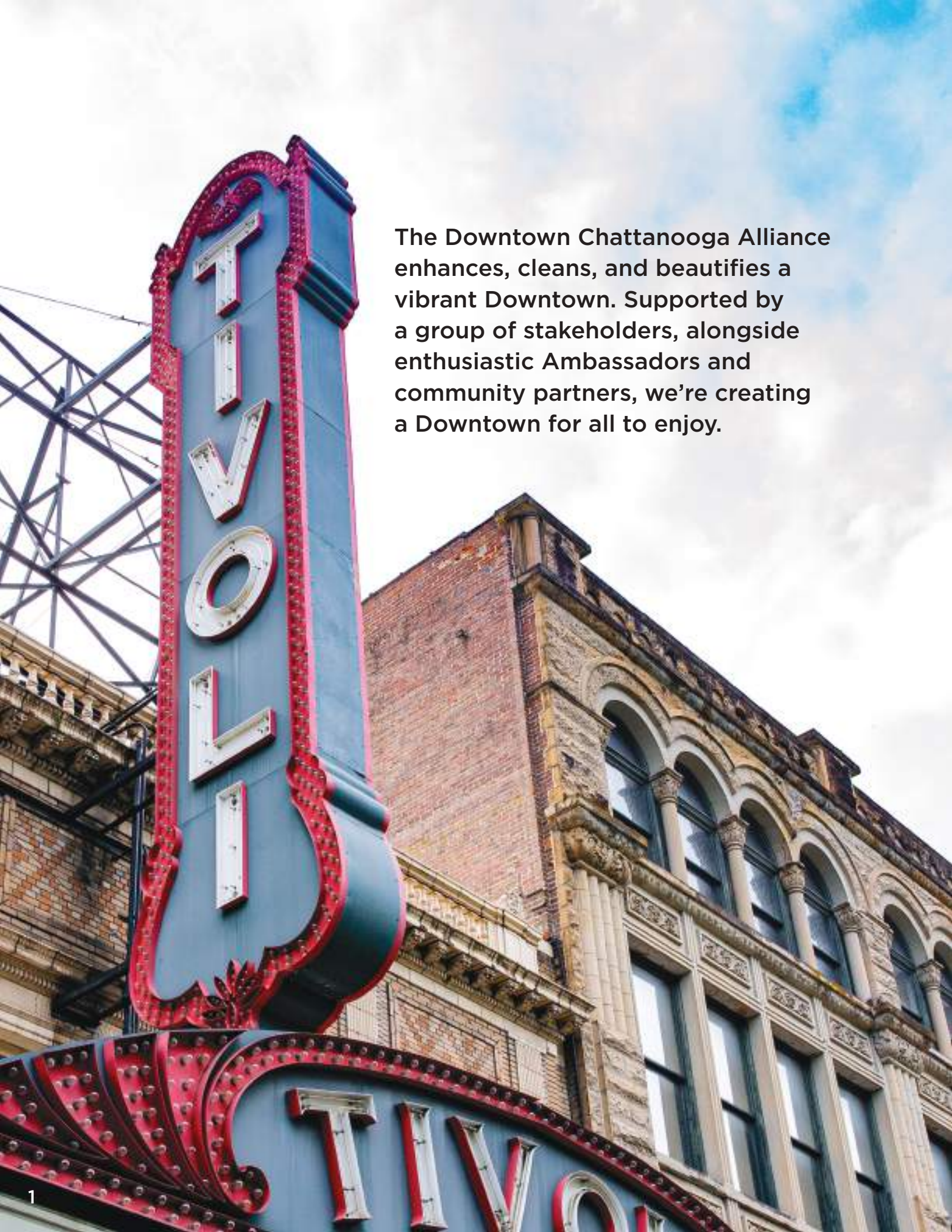

Letter from the Director

Since the Downtown Chattanooga Alliance launched in April 2020, we've implemented many programs and initiatives – Cash for Trash, delivering on-street services through our DCA Ambassadors, cleaning and beautifying Downtown, and building relationships with wonderful partners like you.

We got our start amidst a pandemic and a social justice movement fostering needed conversation around racial equity. We hired Ambassadors at a time when finding talent is an unprecedented challenge. Against a backdrop of historic events, we removed 3,700 bags of trash, made 22,000 recommendations to Downtown visitors, pulled weeds from 540 block faces, and accomplished much more, which you'll read about in the following pages.

There's no doubt that Downtown is cleaner. I see it with my own eyes, and the DCA receives regular compliments from visitors and district members alike.

But we're not just about cleaning up. In fact, we're mainly about people. We help district businesses thrive, support people experiencing homelessness, and ensure visitors have fun, inviting Downtown experiences.

We can't do this work alone, and many others contribute to our clean, vibrant Downtown: The City of Chattanooga's Public Works, Parks, and Public Art Departments; Chattanooga Department of Transportation; Chattanooga Police Department; City of Chattanooga former Mayor Andy Berke's office and now Mayor Tim Kelly's; Office of the City Treasurer; City of Chattanooga Homeless Services; the Community Kitchen; River City Company; the Hamilton County Health Department; TransCard; Collins Landscaping; the Barn Nursery; EPB; and other partners. We've made big strides and look forward to doing even more to make Downtown a better place for everyone.

How can you help? My favorite recommendations: buy a sandwich, grab a treat, and shop small to support the Downtown businesses that make our community dynamic.

We can't wait to see you around Downtown!

Ambassadors

Keeping Downtown Clean & Inviting

Our Ambassadors keep Downtown clean, safe, and visitor-ready.

We built a team of **14** friendly Ambassadors to help downtown visitors:

- Find parking
- Take group photos
- Walk safely to their cars
- Find things to do and places to eat
- Find cool places to take photos
- Locate businesses and services

Ambassadors also execute our cleaning and beautification efforts and receive special training on how to support our unhoused community members.

Trash for Cash

PILOT PROGRAM

Participants in this program earned \$4 in credit for each bag of trash they collected, up to \$20 per day.

We paid \$13,972 to unhoused people in the form of cards to use at Downtown restaurants and stores.

\$13,972 Paid
3,493 Bags redeemed
10,129 Pounds of trash collected

Cash for Trash program showed success, but drew more participation than funding supported.

Providing Support

Ambassadors have social services training and direct connections with social services providers.

Here's how we've assisted community members experiencing homelessness:

415 Individual in-depth engagements
(each 3+ minutes)
394 Referrals for shelter and food
155 Articles of clothing
11 Referrals to addiction treatment programs

We have a guy we call Happy Feet; all of his things were stolen. We got him a meal, gathered up some things like a backpack and toiletries. That made my day.

I hear all the time that people love the work we're doing and how much they enjoy Downtown. I feel good about what I'm doing every day.
