



CLIENT ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

1. Income

The Immigrant and Refugee Law Center provides pro bono legal services to low-income immigrant and refugee families. All applicants' household income must be at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines.

2. Types of Cases

The Immigrant and Refugee Law Center only assists with civil cases. IRLC does not assist with criminal cases or traffic violations, including traffic tickets, or with revenue generating cases. The majority of cases are related to immigration assistance. The Center may refer other types of civil cases such as family and matters to volunteer attorneys.

3. Conflicts of Interest

Lawyers must avoid conflicts of interest that arise from talking with both parties of a dispute. The Immigrant and Refugee Law Center will ask for information about the person, business or agency with whom you are having a problem to identify any potential conflicts of interest. If an individual applies for services on behalf of another person, IRLC will determine whether staff can speak to that individual or whether it must speak directly with the person on behalf of whom the individual is applying, both to avoid conflicts and to assure that we can obtain adequate information about the client and case.

4. Immigration Status

The Immigrant and Refugee Law Center provides services to individuals regardless of their immigration status.
