On the 10th anniversary of the release of the Review of Funding for Schooling (Gonski Report), the Centre for Public Education Research (CPER) is holding a major conference in Sydney to examine the current state of school funding in Australia.

Issues explored will include:

- the promise of the Gonski Review and what has happened since
- the relationship between high performing systems and resourcing
- an up-to-date analysis of the current Schooling Resource Standard funding model
- the equity areas: the growing gaps and the unmet needs
- the link between teachers' working conditions and recurrent funding
- enrolment projections, student complexity and capital requirements into the future.

Dr Ken Boston AO FACE

Ken was a member of the Gonski Review of Funding for Schooling (2010–11) and the Gonski Review to Achieve Educational Excellence in Australian Schools (2017–18).



Trevor Cobbold

Trevor has been National Convenor of Save Our Schools since it was established in 2006. He has authored many papers and submissions on education policy and funding.



Lyndsay Connors AO

Lyndsay has been an advocate for the principle that the primary obligation of government in relation to schooling is to maintain a strong and socially inclusive public school system as a foundation for an open, informed and fair society.



Emeritus Professor Geoff Gallop

Geoff was the Premier of Western Australia 2001-2006 and Director of the University of Sydney's Graduate School of Government 2006-2015. He chaired the Independent Inquiry into the Teaching Profession.



Adam Rorris

Adam was the Manager of the Schools Resourcing Taskforce where he advised Commonwealth and State Ministers of Education on school resourcing and was the lead author of the research paper on funding for disadvantaged students commissioned by the Gonski review.



Professor Pasi Sahlberg

Pasi is a Professor of Education Policy at the UNSW Sydney. He has held senior education expert posts at World Bank, European Commission, and Finnish Government.



Dr Rachel Wilson

Rachel is Associate Professor in Educational Assessment, Evaluation and Research Methods at the University of Sydney.
