


THE BATTLE OF AYUN KARA

On November 14th 1917 – the three regiments of the New Zealand Brigade fought an entrenched Ottoman division at a place called Ayun Kara (a site near Ness Ziona). This battle cost the New Zealanders 53 dead and 140 wounded and is counted by both Israeli and New Zealand historians as New Zealand's greatest, and most costly victory in the Palestine campaign.

Following the battle, a friendship developed between the New Zealanders and the Jewish communities of Rishon LeZion and Ness Ziona.

In 1918 a wooden memorial obelisk was built for the first anniversary of the battle to commemorate the soldiers who had fallen in the battle. This has sadly perished and it's time to make a permanent monument.

Members of the Jewish communities undertook to maintain the graves and the memorial. These soldiers were later re-interred in the British Commonwealth War Cemetery at Ramlah and the original obelisk was eventually lost.



MILITARY BACKGROUND

The New Zealand Mounted Rifles Brigade (NZMR) was made up of 3 New Zealand mounted regiments: the Auckland, Wellington and Canterbury Mounted Regiments which sailed from New Zealand as part of the main body of 6000 men and 4000 horses in October, 1914.

In April 1916, four months after withdrawing from Gallipoli in December 1915, the Australia and NZ Mounted Division was created in Egypt.

It included the New Zealand Brigade and two Australian Light Horse brigades. The division pursued the German and Ottoman forces across the Northern Sinai, and into Palestine from 1916 to 1918.

After the Ottoman Army was defeated at Beersheba on October 31 1917, the Turks withdrew into the Judean Hills pursued by the Mounted brigades up the Coastal Plains towards Jaffa.

In agreement with the community of Ness Ziona the New Zealand Israel Friendship Association (NZILFA) initiated a project to donate a unique, New Zealand Silver Fern sculpture to replace the lost obelisk as a fitting memorial to the 18,000 New Zealanders who served in the Mounted Rifles Brigade during WW1.

A similar sculpture stands as a feature for Sarona Park Estate, Omanawa in the Bay of Plenty. In agreement with the designer of the original fern sculpture, Mr Warren Dawson, fundraising began at the end of 2019. The Fern sculpture will also celebrate the historical connection between the Jewish communities of Ness Ziona, Israel and New Zealand.

It is envisaged that a series of information plaques will be placed around the sculpture which will explain the role played by the New Zealand Mounted Rifles Brigade in Egypt and the Holy Land from 1916–1918. The text on the plaques will be in English and Hebrew.



The Silver Fern has been a national symbol of New Zealand for over a century.

A stainless steel sculpture of the Silver Fern has been commissioned by the New Zealand Israel Friendship Association (NZILFA) on behalf of all New Zealanders, to commemorate the New Zealand soldiers who served in the Sinai Desert and in the Holy Land during WW1.

Standing approximately 4.8m high, this sculpture will be prominently displayed near the battle site. It will be supported with information resources, in both Hebrew and English, which tell the story of the New Zealand Mounted Rifles Brigade from 1916–1918.

AN AWAKENING RELATIONSHIP

During 2017 a group of New Zealanders attended the centenary commemorations of the Battle of Ayun Kara in Ness Zione. This visit was reciprocated by Mr Joseph (Yossi) Eshed and his wife Michal who came to NZ twice in 2018.

On their second visit the Esheds connected with Mr Warren Dawson whose grandfather served in the WW1 campaign. Warren and Robyn were invited to Israel and Warren spoke at commemorations about his grandfather's experience during WW1.

Mr Eshed who is co-chair of the Israel NZ Friendship Association will oversee the Fern Project in Israel.
