# THE CHURCH CRACKED OPEN

A Book Study Taking Place On Certain Wednesdays This Fall

This fall, we are joining friends from Calvary Stonington and St. James New London and going on a journey into the past, present, and future of the church. With the Rev. Stephanie Spellers as our guide, we will look at how the Church became entangled with Empire, and then practice the ways God is calling us to let go of that identity going forward. Spellers contends that we are in a special moment where we as the church can choose our path. She says, "Decades of disruption and decline – culminating in the crises of pandemic, economic collapse, and racial reckoning – might be the shove we need to recenter away from empire and onto God and God's dream."

Spellers frames The Church Cracked Open with the gospel story of the woman anointing Jesus with the contents of her alabaster jar. Jesus admires this woman after her profoundly disruptive appearance. Spellers says, "[Jesus] must have valued her ability to discern what's important. Some disciples obsessed over the container, but what good is an exquisite jar if the ointment it holds can't get out? Others were anxious about losing the expensive nard, but what good is life-giving ointment if you don't share it with people in their time of need? She broke the jar. She poured out the oil. God blesses her for it."

Over the eight sessions of our time together, we will work our way through The Church Cracked Open. We will look at the reality of the church in its past and present context – the gore and the glory. And then we will talk about the practices of kenosis (that is, emptying of power and privilege), solidarity, and discipleship. Along the way, Spellers will provide modern examples of Christians who revealed the dream of God during the time of imperial entanglement.

A book of revelations, The Church Cracked Open will crack our hearts open so the authentic dream of God can filter in and escape out.
