The year 2022 has been a time of big strides forward in our capital campaign building projects, and also one of some treading water. First, the biggest of strides: we turned on our 130-panel solar plant in January, and as of the week before Thanksgiving, we have generated over 52 megawatt/hours of electricity this year. Wow! Every morning when I walk out of my kitchen door, I smile at the solar array, knowing that we have leveraged the flat roof of the education wing in such a wonderful way. I am overjoyed that we at St. Mark's are caring for God's creation by producing A LOT of energy in such a sustainable way.

The exterior refurbishment of the apartment has come a long way this year, as well. In 2021, all the work was done to re-grade the ground, plant grass, and build a new retaining wall. This year we made progress on the actual building. We took the old porch off the memorial garden side and cut a place on the back of the building for a new set of double doors. New cedar shakes are going up as of this writing, which will then be painted to look like the rest of the church. But the big news is that the original doors of the church are now hanging on the facade of the apartment as a sort of art installation and piece of historical preservation. When seen from the memorial garden, the doors give the impression of the front entrance to the church. The whole project is making the garden more inviting and more solemn for the important work we do there.

Lastly, the energy conversion and air conditioning project in the church has gone through multiple design revisions over the last year, and we are getting closer to a final idea as to how to deliver the new heating and cooling system to the church building. The biggest issue we have had to contend with this year is air exchange regulations that we will be subject to once we change anything about the current system. This has caused some levels of complexity that we were not prepared for when we began the project. The team is working through it gamely.

And speaking of the team, I cannot say enough good things about our building team. Rob Christian, Lee Watrous, Kurt Cramer, Doug Barrett, and Bill Loweth continue to shepherd our projects. Jeff Cloutier helps when he's back in town. Ken Sigel has stepped back from the team after ably leading the planning stages of the energy conversion since 2020. Eric McDermott has advised us on many things having do with electricity, and Susan Kietzman is working on grants to help pay for the projects. I feel blessed to be surrounded by such a dedicated and knowledgeable team.
