## Spotlight: Sixth and I

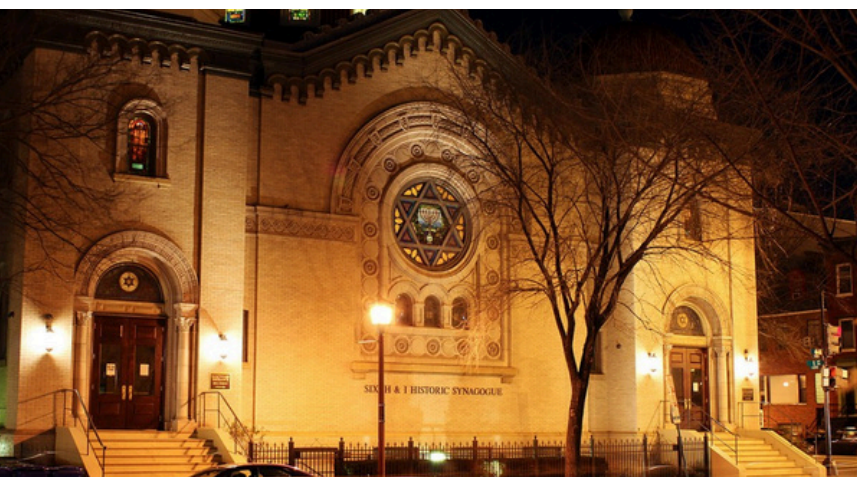

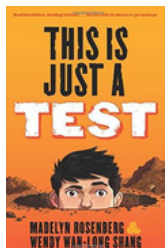
