





My art has evolved over my 13 years of painting. I pretty much paint plein air and I paint with Gamblin Oil using just three colors and white. I usually cover my canvas with red acrylic paint. I then draw what I'm going to paint with a large brush and dark acrylic paint. While that's drying I put out my oils. Usually I use cobalt blue, cadmium red light, cadmium yellow light and titanium white. From these I mix all my colors and I approach my painting with bold strokes and work quickly.

My main concern is design. Leaves, flowers, and geometric are sources of inspiration. The designs are printed on silk panels using polychromatic screen printing, a unique method I developed, combining both painting and printing resulting in 4-6 prints. All colors of an image are painted directly on one print screen, then printed with one pull of a squeegee into fabric. Panels look delicate but are strong and durable. They attach to U-shaped mountings.



CERAMICS

Italian style maioliche painted ceramics—an item is created from clay and then fired. The bisque fired piece is dipped into a white majolica lead-free glaze. After drying a line drawing is pounced with charcoal power, or drawn with pencil, over the glaze. The design is painted on the piece using powered Italian pigments and minerals. Then it is sprayed with a clear crystalline glaze. It is slowly (over a period of 12+ hours) fired to cone 010. This slow firing retains the color's intensity.

I roll out clay slabs to make coils. These are used to create sculptures. They are fired and then painted or dipped in glazes and fired again. I am visually impaired and it is difficult to glaze things. Sometimes I dip pieces and then spatter paint on the details. My favorite things to sculpt are frogs and reptiles. I would like to animate them like claymation and make movies! Seriously, I try to get movement, as if my frogs and lizards are jumping, or catching flies.
