Terms such as space, perspective, creativity, movement, and abstraction itself are being explored and illustrated by the artist via his own popular vernacular. Based on the assumption that no experience is pure, but instead a composite of psychology and conditioning, Jason Rhoades creates sculpture that avoids being seen as a whole, both visually and intellectually. Instead the artist creates a labyrinth of information, in which the production of meaning jumps back and forth from the literal to the abstract, creating a multitude of associations along the way. The conceptual model for the complexity of this sculpture is that of the dialogue. In the dialogue, linear logic can give way to the notion of veering as ideas are being changed and developed. The ability to veer or better to deviate is essential to the creative process and fundamental for Jason Rhoades' work. The willingness to engage in a dialogue and the willingness to veer are also prerequisites to any understanding of his art."
