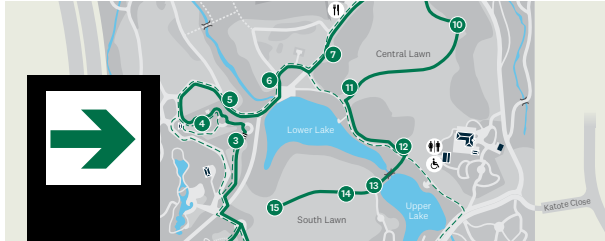

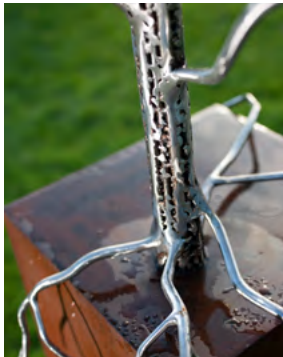


How to enjoy the exhibition

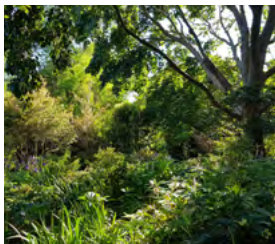


Indoor gallery

Small sculptural works are displayed for sale in our Indoor Gallery of the Huakaiwaka visitor centre. Make sure you view the framed concept sketches of the outdoor works and see if you think the artists achieved their vision. These can be found in the corridor opposite the toilets.

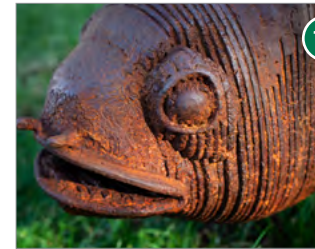

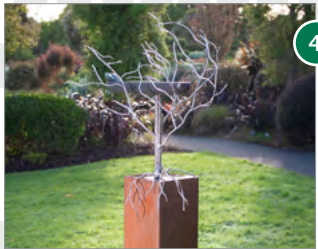

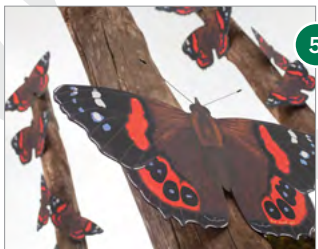
