With the support of the philanthropic community as well as Fulton and Dekalb Counties, renovations are well underway at our Ponce de Leon Center. This world-class

facility houses one of the largest, most comprehensive HIV treatment centers in the United States. Now, it boasts a newly-renovated Oral Health Center which provides routine and emergency dental health services for those living with HIV/AIDS—a population with a high incidence of oral health problems. It is the only clinic of its kind in metro Atlanta.

Grady now has the most advanced and incredible dental program for any patient population in the state of Georgia. It's just remarkable.

Addressing Cancer Treatment Disparities

Thanks to a generous investment from the Merck Foundation, Grady has been able to implement highly-effective, cuttingedge cancer treatment methods that are having a tremendously positive impact on our patients.



Prior to implementation, the average time from diagnosis to treatment was well above 30 days



Now, the average time from diagnosis to treatment has improved to 24 days. For GYN-related cancers, the time from diagnosis to treatment has been reduced to 11 days.

By integrating distress screening tools into our electronic medical records system, 90 percent of patients needing same-day intervention now receive it. The navigation team is instrumental to ensuring that patients are referred to services more quickly.

BUILDING GRADY'S FUTURE



This year, Grady lost one of our greatest champions. Pete Correll played an integral role in supporting and rebuilding Grady Health System, using his extensive knowledge

as a businessman and philanthropist to help ensure Grady remains the world-class health care institution that it is today.

Among Pete Correll's long list of contributions to Grady was a generous donation to help fund the construction of the Correll Pavilion, where his name will be immortalized in honor of his selfless contributions to our health

system and community. The state-of-the-art facility is set to open in Fall 2022.

TRAINING THE NEXT GENERATION AT GRADY

Pathways 2 Success



The past year has underscored how critical frontline clinical teams are to Grady's ability to meet the health care needs of our community. Given the extremely competitive environment for nurses and allied health

professionals, the retention of skilled staff is a top priority for our health system. Last year, with support from The Home Depot Foundation, Grady was able to launch the Pathways 2 Success (P2S) program to help employees – particularly entry-level frontline staff – obtain the training and certifications necessary to advance professionally. While Grady has traditionally offered tuition reimbursement for employees who chose to further their career by enrolling in academic, training or certification programs, for many employees – especially those in lower-paying positions – that help was not enough. The Grady Pathways 2 Success program goes a step further by covering salaries while employees are pursuing training, assisting with obtainment of certifications, and helping with career mapping and planning.

The Larry L. Moyer Memorial Scholarship



Grady Radiologic Technology students will now have the opportunity for a scholarship because of a family's desire to honor a loved one. Larry Moyer gave his all for Grady as an Interventional Radiology Technologist, and his family chose to honor him by establishing

the Larry L. Moyer Memorial Scholarship. The first student recipient will be selected in the spring of 2022.

"When I was considering what we could do as a memoriam, it occurred to me that because he was always so passionate about working at Grady and being a graduate of their radiology program, the perfect thing would be to pay it

forward to someone else who shares the same passion. He would have been very proud and humbled. If anyone has any thoughts of giving a gift to Grady, if it is on your heart to do it, just go ahead and do it," said his wife, Nealy Moyer.



Veterans to EMTs






