

A Word from Dr. Ryan Baer

Dear friends in Christ,

Near the village of McBaine, Missouri, about a half mile from the banks of the Missouri River, stands a burr oak tree that is estimated to be between 350 and 400 years old. It stands 90 feet tall and its branches span 130 feet, and its trunk is nearly 24 feet in

circumference. It was already standing tall when the Lewis and Clark Expedition paddled by in 1804. It has survived lightning strikes, droughts, and floods, and local residents and students at the nearby University of Missouri simply refer to it as "The Big Tree."

I've been thinking about "The Big Tree" as we enter the Fall season. We have endured much, and we have much for which to give thanks, and our theme for this year is "Growing in Grace and Gratitude." 
