GENERAL INFORMATION

Show information and entry forms can be found at: https://www.patrickcountyfair.com/exhibits

- Competition is closed, only youth are allowed to participate.
- Wood chips will be provided for bedding. If you wish to use anything else, you must bring your own.
- The livestock barn will be manned 24/7 all week of the agricultural fair.
- A limit of 25 head to be exhibited for beef cattle.
- A limit of 30 head to be exhibited for sheep.
- A limit of 30 head to be exhibited for goat.
- A limit of 15 head to be exhibited for rabbit.
- A limit of 15 head to be exhibited for cavy.
- A limit of 15 birds if displayed all week, **no limit IF only competing in the Friday show**.
- A vet will check all animals from 2-4 pm on show days, i.e. Cattle on Wednesday, Sheep on Thursday, etc. Any exhibitor not there at that time MUST show 30-day health papers and contact either Cameron Kolinski or Wayne Kirkpatrick with Rotary to schedule a drop off time.
- There will be no substitutions, changes, or additions after entries are made.
- All exhibitors are limited to one animal per class, except where classes are broken by weight.
- If an animal gets loose in the show ring an exhibitor will be given one chance to regain control of the animal. After the second incidence exhibitor and animal will be dismissed from the show ring.
- Any animal deemed dangerously unruly by show management will be dismissed immediately and asked to leave the fairgrounds.
- Other animals entering fairgrounds: Any animal of the below species entering the fairgrounds regardless of their purpose of entry must meet the requirements that are listed below for that species.
- Mandatory: Livestock must stay in barn until 10:00PM on the day of the show.







ENTRIES

- Entries must be submitted by **Sunday, September 1, 2024**.
- NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- There are NO Entry Fees for any species at the 2024 Show
- All youth exhibitors' ages are determined by January 1 of the current year.
- Show management reserves the right to limit entries based on space.
- Judges' decisions will be final.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

Health regulations will be strictly enforced, and decisions of the attending veterinarian concerning animal health status are final. No animals may be unloaded on the fairgrounds before checked and approved by the attending veterinarian.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS WHO ARE UNABLE TO ARRIVE AT THE CHECK IN TIMES MUST HAVE 30 DAY HEALTH CERTIFICATES, AND THE REQUIRED TESTS. (SEE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES)

All species must follow specific entry requirements listed under each class rules and regulations. All entries shall be inspected prior to unloading. Any and all animals not meeting the entry requirements and/or exhibiting any signs of disease or illness, may be refused entry, required to be isolated and/or required to be returned to the farm of origin.

CATTLE

The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, tattoo, ear tag or some other form of identification (other than the animal's name).
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the cattle listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to communicable disease to the best of his knowledge.
- 4. Information related to brucellosis:
 - a. Those cattle that are native to Virginia need not be tested. (Native meaning those cattle which were born in Virginia or which met Virginia import requirements.)
 - b. Cattle originating from any certified brucellosis free herd, regardless of the state of origin, may enter Virginia, provided the following information is recorded on the official certificate:
 - i. The individual identification of the animal
 - ii. The herd certification number
 - iii. The date of the last herd test, and
 - iv. A permit when otherwise required in the rule
 - c. Cattle imported from a Class Free State shall originate from a herd not under quarantine and need not be tested.
 - d. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this rule, a brucellosis test is not required for steers or spayed females and no test prior to entry into the state is required of:
 - i. Cattle under the age of 8 months.
 - ii. Heifers of the beef breed less than 24 months of age and officially vaccinated against brucellosis.
- 5. Information relating to tuberculosis (cattle):

Any cattle over (6) months of age not originating from a Tuberculosis Free state shall be required to have official tuberculosis test within 30 days of entry, unless from an accredited herd.







HEALTH REGULATIONS (continued)

SHEEP AND GOAT

The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and any registration, tattoo, or ear tag numbers.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the sheep or goats listed are not infected with, or have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.
 - Any animal showing evidence of suspicious fungal lesions must have a signed veterinarian's statement on the health certificate with the date and type of treatment.
- 4. If the sheep originate from a scabies eradication area, a statement from the veterinarian to the effect that the flock of origin is scabies-free, and the animals listed on the health certificate have been dipped under state or federal supervision within ten (10) days prior to entry to the fair.
- 5. All sheep and goats imported from out-of-state must have a brucellosis test within **30 days** prior to entry and a tuberculosis test within **30 days** prior to entry, unless originating from an accredited, certified herd. (This must be stated on the health certificate, along with the date of testing.)
- 6. All sheep and goats must comply with new USDA Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines for more information call 1-800-USDA-TAG.







SHOWMANSHIP

- Showmanship classes are based on the age of the exhibitor as of January 1 of the current year.
- Showmanship is by child, not by animal.
- Pee Wee: any youth ages 8 and younger, children below age 5 must be accompanied by a youth or adult
- Junior: any youth 9 13 years old
- Senior: any youth 14 18 years old
- Showmanship classes will proceed in the following order: PeeWee, Junior, Senior
- All participants may participate in showmanship.
- Showmanship participants must be listed as the exhibitor of that animal to show.
- No uncastrated males in showmanship (Rams, Bulls, Bucks)
- Showmanship classes will be conducted for all three divisions (beef cattle, sheep, and goats)
- Buckles will be awards to the Champion Showman for each age division in the following species,
 cattle, sheep and goats

YOUTH HERDSMAN AWARD

- Awards will be given to one winner in each division: Cattle, Sheep, and Goats.
- Each division winner will receive \$25 and an award (TBA).

• Criteria:

- Area must be kept clean and neat **by the exhibitor**, including the aisle, and tack area, insuring a proper public presentation.
- Animals must be cared for by the exhibitor, bedding should be presentable, water buckets kept full and clean, feed pans stored when not in use.
- Each exhibitor must include an inviting educational exhibit. Be creative and take this
 opportunity to inform the public about your livestock.
- o Judging will go on after check-in times throughout the week.







POULTRY SHOW

(Chickens, Ducks and Turkeys)

Arrival/Check in Time: Friday, September 13-2:00 to 4:00PM

Show Time: Friday, September 13 - Immediately after the goat show is finished

Check In: All poultry MUST be checked in by 4:00PM

- Entries must be submitted by **Sunday, September 1, 2024.**
- No Entry Fee
- NO LATE ENTRIES
- Open to all youth exhibitors ages 18 years and younger as of January 1, 2024
- Open to all residents of Virginia and North Carolina.
- A limit of 15 birds to be exhibited.
- No diseased or managed stock is allowed in the fair.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own coop, shavings, and feed.
- Grand Champion of each type (Chicken, Turkey, Duck) receives \$10 and a rosette.
- Virginia state law requires all poultry shown in exhibition to be tested for pullorum thyphoid
 disease or originate from certified pullorum thyphoid free flocks. All birds entered in this fair
 must have been tested prior to being brought to the fairgrounds, unless prior arrangements are
 made with the show superintendent for testing at the fair. Birds must wear test leg bands unless
 they originate from pullorum free flocks. Testing will be available on Tuesday.
- All poultry will be judged by the American Poultry Standard and the American Bantam Standard.
- All entries must be listed by Breed. Specify if you are entering Bantams.
- All poultry will be exhibited at the sole risk of the exhibitor. The Patrick County Agricultural Fair, Inc. will not be responsible for any accidents, mistakes, loss or damages arising from any cause whatsoever. Every precaution will be taken to give adequate care to exhibits.

- A limit of 15 Rabbits/Cavy to be exhibited.
- No diseased or managed stock is allowed in the fair.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own pen, shavings, and feed.
- Grand Champion of Rabbit and Cavy receives \$10 and a rosette.
- All rabbits and cavy will be judged by the American Rabbit Breeders Standards and American Cavy Breeders Standards.
- All entries must be listed by Breed.

- Open to all youth exhibitors ages 18 years and younger as of January 1, 2024
- Open to all residents of Virginia and North Carolina.
- A limit of 25 head to be exhibited. If entries reach this before the deadline, entries will close.
- Beef Cattle ONLY Female or Cow-Calf pairs ONLY
- There will be no single breed shows; therefore, all breeds will be shown together.
- Grand Champion receives \$100 and a banner.
- Reserve Champion receives \$50 and a banner.
