## DIRECTOR'S NOTE by HARRY TURPIN

I fell in love with *Jesus Christ Superstar* in the 10th grade, circa 1993. My best friend, Claire, was obsessed with the original London concept album and put it on for me one afternoon. I couldn't get the rock licks out of my head for days and had to own my own copy.

Since then, I have listened to and collected so many versions of the show. The one that sticks out the most to me - and was most likely the germination of this idea we see now - is the concept album featuring Amy Ray from the Indigo Girls as Jesus as well as a whole host of other musical stars.

When approached about doing this show, I went with a concept that I had been seeing play out in our social media-conscious world: what happens when someone is plucked from obscurity, thrown into the spotlight, says one thing wrong because they weren't trained for this, and ends up canceled? We've seen it time and time again...remember Leave Britney Alone? Or the golden-voiced singer who happened to be homeless? What happens when we give them the world and then take it away because \*we\* have now deemed them unworthy?

As I listened to the lyrics and read the story, it seemed to me that this story of Jesus Christ would fit perfectly with the director's mission for this show: we like to watch people succeed but we love to watch them fail. As sad as that is, it is unfortunately woven into the fabrics of our lives. Think of everyone who has achieved a modicum of success. Instantly, the dirt comes out. They can't be all that good.

It's through that lens that I've decided to set this production of *Jesus Christ Superstar*. I believe this show gives us a chance to take something familiar, yet older, and view it through the lens of the media trappings we have today.

Superstar has been an incredible labor of love and we could NOT have gotten here without the numerous people who have dedicated their time and energy to make and create the things you're about to watch. Thank you to every single member of the JCS team, both cast and crew, for your faith and your trust in this journey. Everything's all right, everything's fine.:)

To you - our audience: thank you for coming out and supporting the arts. The pandemic has done a number on our audiences and we at Reboot are absolutely delighted and ecstatic to have you in the audience. We appreciate you more than you can know.

**Scot Charles Anderson (Production Manager)** Scot (he/him) is a first-time PM for Reboot. As a member of the Reboot working board, Scot has performed such duties as FOH manager, box office, errand person, truck driver, lobby display setter upper, set builder, laundry, and the infamous back-stage blood duty.

Andrew Lloyd Webber (Music) Andrew Lloyd Webber is the composer of some of the world's best-known musicals including Cats, Evita, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar, The Phantom of the Opera and Sunset Boulevard. In February 2017, when Sunset Boulevard joined School of Rock – The Musical, Cats, and Phantom on Broadway, he became the only person to equal the record set in 1953 by Rodgers and Hammerstein with four shows running concurrently. His productions also include the groundbreaking Bombay Dreams, which introduced the double Oscar-winning Bollywood composer AR Rahman to the Western stage.

As a composer and producer, Lloyd Webber is one of an elite group of artists to have achieved EGOT status by receiving an Emmy, four Grammys including Best Contemporary Classical Composition for *Requiem*, his setting of the Latin Requiem mass, an Oscar, and eight Tony Awards including the 2018 Special Tony for Lifetime Achievement in the Theatre. He has won seven Oliviers and a Golden Globe and his honors include the Praemium Imperiale, the Richard Rodgers Award for Excellence in Musical Theatre, a BASCA Fellowship, and the Kennedy Center Honor. He owns seven London theatres including the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, and the London Palladium. He is the only theatre owner to re-invest every cent of profits into his buildings.

He is passionate about the importance of music in education and the Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation has become one of Britain's leading charities supporting the arts and music. In 2016 the Foundation funded a major new national initiative which endowed the American Theatre Wing with a \$1.3 million, three-year grant to support theatre education opportunities for young people and public schools across the U.S.

He was knighted by Her Majesty The Queen in 1992 and created a life peer in 1997. To mark his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday, his bestselling autobiography *Unmasked* was published by HarperCollins in March 2018.

Tim Rice (Lyrics) has worked in music, theatre and films since 1965 when he met Andrew Lloyd Webber, a fellow struggling songwriter. Rather than pursue Tim's ambitions to write rock or pop songs they turned their attention to Andrew's obsession—musical theatre. Their first collaboration (lyrics by Tim, music by Andrew) was an unsuccessful show based on the life of Dr. Barnardo, the Victorian philanthropist, *The Likes Of Us.* Their next three works together were much more successful—*Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Jesus Christ Superstar*, and *Evita*.

Tim has since worked with other distinguished popular composers such as Elton John (*The Lion King, Aida*), Alan Menken (*Aladdin, King David, Beauty and the Beast*), Bjorn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson (*Chess*), and most recently, Stuart Brayson (*From Here To Eternity*).

In March 2017, two films with new Tim Rice material were released. Disney's fresh interpretation of *Beauty and the Beast*, directed by Bill Condon, features three new songs written with Alan Menken, and the latest Roger Goldby film, *Time of Their Lives*, starring Joan


Collins and Pauline Collins, features "Morty and Me," a song written with Pete Hobbs, sung by Sophie Ellis-Bextor.

In 2018 became one of only 15 people to reach EGOT status, when the NBC production of *Jesus Christ Superstar Live in Concert* won an Emmy for Outstanding Variety Special.

### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Theatre Off Jackson acknowledges that we are operating on the ancestral lands of the Duwamish people who are the original stewards of this land and continue to live here today. We honor the work of Indigenous artists in our community and understand how important Indigenous art is to the future of this land. The Duwamish people have an oral history that stretches back to the last Ice Age. Their ancestral lands encompass the Seattle/Greater King County area, and they have given care and Lushshootseed names to the geography that surrounds us today. An acknowledgement like this is nowhere near enough to heal a history of colonization and the unkept promises made in The Treaty of Point Elliot in 1855, but it is a start to better align ourselves with Indigenous communities and grow to become stronger advocates for Indigenous rights. Today, the Duwamish still host events and meet at the Duwamish Longhouse located in what we call West Seattle. Reboot Theatre Company, known for its intriguing deep dives and fresh interpretations of theater, brings to life 110 in the Shade, a beautiful exploration of love, hope, and acceptance. Set in a small western town besieged by drought, Lizzie, intelligent and independent, struggles with the societal pressure to do as a "woman" should do. One blistering hot day, Lizzie's family urges her to marry the recently widowed Sheriff File, while charismatic stranger Starbuck comes to town with promises of being able to make it rain. Immediately suspicious, Lizzie tries to pick apart Starbuck's story, but realizes a deeper truth about herself along the way. While the source material was written in the 1950's, director Anderson will take a closer look at the seemingly simplified gender roles in classic Reboot style. seattlepublictheater.org
