## DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Damn Yankees is a show that has a special place in my heart. It was the first musical I ever acted in as a teenager; it has a score filled with boppers, charming characters, and a sweet story about hope, determination, and passion. This is an optimistic world where underdogs pull off the impossible, the devil can be outsmarted, and true love triumphs.

The inspiration for this reboot came from two places. I grew up with a mother who was a huge Mariners fan. I remember listening to her cheer and groan at the TV during countless games; eating hot dogs at the King Dome with her while she explained the rules of the game to me. The concept "sports are for dads" was just never true for me, and I always admired my mother for not subscribing to those gender norms. Much more recently, my wife and I were watching A League of Their Own on the couch, and a random thought entered my brain: "what if you did Damn Yankees but, like, with ladies?"

With this twist in mind, I really wanted to explore how Joe's journey of empathy might deepen now that he would literally be walking in a woman's shoes. As a new father myself, it is often shocking to me how husbands and dads are held to a much lower standard than their spouses; how even well-meaning men still get away with the bare minimum in their relationships, taking on little to no emotional labor. Of course, along with this revelation of male privilege for our hero, I also wanted this production to serve as a celebration of non-cis-male sports fans and female professional athletes alike.

A huge thanks to my fabulous cast and my awesome production team — none of this would have been possible without your beautiful imaginations. And thank YOU for supporting the arts!

This production is dedicated to my late mother Patti—this one's for you, old girl.

Today, the Duwamish still host events and meet at the Duwamish Longhouse located in what we call West Seattle.
