Loneliness II Concept

From May to August 2019, Videocity presented the first Loneliness screening cycle across the city of Basel, Switzerland. Yet, the subject "Loneliness" was rarely as relevant as during the current health crisis, where many find themselves isolated from their families, colleagues and friends. For this reason, the team at Videocity decided to extend the Loneliness cycle with a sequel, starting on 8th March 2021. Over a period of six months, 36 videos by 36 artists from Switzerland and across the world will be presented. Many of the selected artists are young and, for some of them, it is their first exhibition in Switzerland. Every two months, 12 new videos will be shown.

Whilst the first cycle of Loneliness contrasted with the hustle and bustle of the pre-pandemic fairgrounds, the 2021 cycle approaches the subject of loneliness from the angle of a pandemic. The cancellation of numerous events, the limitations on gatherings, international travel and people's social lives have left a strong mark on wellbeing and created a lot of isolation. What long-term impact will the pandemic have for both individuals and businesses? What are the different ways in which loneliness can be manifested? The selected video works use the subject of "Loneliness" as a starting point and open up a conversation on its different forms.


Videocity is a free outdoor screening that can be viewed individually according to personal needs.

Examples of the programme

The Korean artist **Gyonyoung Yoon** depicts the experience of homesickness; the feeling of being far-away from home. In her video work "Filling in the Physical Reality, Living in the Digital Reality", the artist uses digital tools to re-create familiar and comforting environments. It doesn't take years of living abroad to empathize with Gyonyoung Yoon's experience. Homesickness, in the form of missing people, places and even specific tastes and textures is a widely shared feeling. Digital means have now given us tools – even if often palliative and ephemeral – to fill in many of these blanks. However, even though digital technology has been an essential component of living in a global pandemic, often it also emphasises the longing of physical experiences.

The Russian artist **Dmitry Bulnygin** approaches at the connection between the loneliness and our consumerist lifestyles. His work 'Bad Karma' is a representation of a consumerist inferno: a long supermarket queue without end, moving slowly, keeping up with the pace of an (invisible) cashier's scanning. Yet, in the midst of a global pandemic, this 2010 work reminds us of a different time, pre-face masks and social distancing. Whilst we are all longing for everything to back to 'normal', Bulnygin puts the spotlight onto its shortfalls. Is the consumerist rat race really an image of fulfilled life that we should be striving for? 'Bad Karma' remarkably shows no customers interacting, just isolated shoppers with their trolleys and shopping baskets. A survey by the Swiss Federal Statistical Office has shown that, in 2017, 38% of the adult population in Switzerland experienced loneliness. Feelings of isolation, especially for the most vulnerable populations and those living alone, soared in the last 12 months. In a post-pandemic world, could loneliness become a ghost of the past?

The French artist **Natasha Nisic** explores the feeling of loneliness in public spaces in her 'Les Endormies' by filming commuters on the Tokyo's underground drifting into sleep. For if there is one moment when one is alone with oneself, it is when one sleeps. With their heads bowed, their eyes contemplate an elsewhere that exists only for them. As we come across these distant figures, they seem very close to us. The passengers on the trams crossing the Messeplatz may also have heavy eyelids and eyes that close, while for a moment they unknowingly make eye contact with fellow travellers, companions in their solitude.



Loneliness II 12 videos by 12 artists

Location

eBoard Congress Center Basel, Messeplatz 21 , 4058 Basel (outdoor screening on a billboard)

Integral to this location are the sounds of the city that replace the original soundtracks of the video works. Coincidences of everyday life – noises and reflections – intervene with the compositions; they can emphasise or contradict aesthetic elements and thus interact with the works. The surroundings allow the video works to be seen in a new light in busy public space of the city of Basel. The video works contrast with the hustle and bustle of the public square, gain a whole new meaning.

Every day, from 08:00 to 24:00, 12 videos without sound will be shown on the eBoard of the Congress Center Basel at Messeplatz 21 near the Swissôtel Le Plaza. There may be occasional breaks in the presentation.

About Videocity

Videocity is a public art project founded in Basel, Switzerland in 2013. Its aims are to support video artists and to mediate video art to diverse audiences, both indoors and outdoors, and especially in unusual locations and free of charge. The project was initiated by Dr Andrea Domesle and is currently composed of a large network of international research assistants. In 2019, Videocity was awarded the recognition of Swiss audio-visual heritage (Kulturgut der Schweiz). This was the first time that a curatorial project received such designation in Switzerland. Further information about the locations and partners

The **Exhibition Square** (Messeplatz) in Basel, with its exhibition halls and the cone of light designed by Herzog & de Meuron, the "Eye to the Sky", is a very special place: both a hub for Basel traffic and for people from near and far, for cultures, products, innovations and ideas. It is a "place of lively exchange, presentation, experimentation, observation, learning and knowledge transfer. It is a dynamic place. Here new things can be tested, decisions are made that sometimes even show their relevance worldwide in the future". (Jonas Scharf, Managing Director *Congress Center* Basel). Coming from Badischer Bahnhof, the route to the city centre leads via Messeplatz.

Partners

What they all have in common is that they encourage exchange, inspiration and new encounters. With the simultaneous presentation of partly the same videos, both the *Congress Center* Basel and the media library FHNW offer different points of reference and spatial contexts and thus allow the videos to be experienced differently in each case.

Videocity

Since 2013 *videocity* has been opening up new ways for culture and business to interact. Basel's shops and cultural institutions open their shop windows and halls or make their billboards available to video artists. For a few weeks *videocity.bs* becomes an intangible part of Basel and encourages unexpected encounters. The videos allow everyday life to appear in a new light and, vice versa, everyday life to appear in the videos. Since then, during the nine editions of approximately six-week of *videocity.bs*, around 100 video works by around 100 artists - Pipilotti Rist was present three times and Ursula Palla twice - have been shown.

In 2013, 2014 and 2015, *videocity* formed a multi-stage parcours between exhibition site (Messeplatz), market place (Marktplatz), the SBB railway station and the St. Jakobs Stadium. Since 2016, *videocity.bs* has been focusing on the major locations: the eBoards of the *Congress Center* Basel and the *videocity.bs* shop window at GLOBUS Basel department store. In 2017, the media library joined, after the Academy of Art and Design FHNW moved into its new building the FHNW tower block situated in the Dreispitz area. *Videocity* shows videos without sound at the public locations and experiments with the influence of the city sounds and surroundings on perception and how artists integrate this situation into their compositions. The presentation in the media library offers a comparison, as the works are made with the original sound and are intended for indoor spaces.

Each year since 2017, an artist has been offered the unique opportunity to create a site-specific work especially for the media facades of the City Lounge, North Hall and South Hall at the Messeplatz in Basel with its unique architecture conceived by Herzog & de Meuron, in the so-called "Eye to the Sky". The work of art exists only temporarily at this exceptional location.

Videocity is a platform for the wider public, professionals, art lovers and amateurs, beyond protected museum walls. It was developed for the city and its cultural scene by the Basel-based cultural manager and curator Dr. Andrea Domesle and presented together with Mathias F. Böhm, managing director of Pro Innerstadt Basel.

Congress Center Basel

The *Congress Center* Basel - the largest congress centre in Switzerland in terms of space - hosts over 200 events each year with around 200,000 visitors. The *Congress Center* Basel is directly connected to the Herzog & de Meuron exhibition hall via a passage way. Only a few other locations in Europe

have a congress centre with a direct link to a trade fair site. This way, such combined events, which are increasingly in demand, find their optimal conditions. With its modern infrastructure, *Congress Center* Basel is playing in the international arena.

The **media library of the Academy of Art and Design FHNW** offers a relaxed, concentrated and stylish study atmosphere, accessible to students and interested members of the public. There is literature on the displayed artists. Further, there is video art, thanks to its special keywording into subject areas, allows for comparative research. The media library collection of literature and media (including important collections on the subject of the video) embodies the ideal embedding of the project in a scientific, artistic and research environment.
