

Legacy Connector Planning Update June 28, 2023


Thank you to everyone that joined us on May 31st for the Pre-Construction Walk. We look forward to having everyone out again following project completion later this year!

We're pleased to report that construction for the Legacy Connector began ahead of schedule on Friday, June 9th. The construction entrance has been established on Algonquin Trail at the base of Legacy Park. Site clearing, tree fencing for preservation, and erosion control installation, and site grading are the initial activities in the process.

Since work has begun, regular monitoring is ongoing by City of Greenville inspections and Arbor Source, a third-party arborist focused on the optimization of tree health and environmental conditions during construction. To date, the cleared area is within the approved limits of disturbance (LOD) area, and the site crew has been able to save a number of trees inside the LOD. The crew is working to review a few more trees based on their compromised health condition, but we believe the crew will be able to remove fewer trees than originally planned and approved through permitting.

The width of the clearing will provide the necessary safe access for equipment and vehicles making material delivery. The construction team will perform all work during approved construction hours—M-F 7am-7pm, Sat 8am-4pm, and Sun 1pm-4pm. Crew parking is limited on Algonquin, with overflow parking available within the grassy area of Legacy Square. The planning team and crew meet weekly to discuss and coordinate logistics for the upcoming 7-day period. Updates to nearby property owners will be coordinated as increased construction vehicle activity is necessary.

The cleared area of the trail will be graded for proper trail slope and include a supportive shoulder area for planting new trees and landscaping. A tremendous amount of study and field review was done to ensure the best trail alignment. Along the entire trail, plans call for an efficient grading transition to promote stabilization and minimal site impact. Final plans, in collaboration with the City of Greenville, call for supplemental plantings along the trail to provide a visual buffer and a natural vegetative transition between the new trail edge and existing conditions. Facts about the Legacy Connector Project

Construction Schedule (Update): Construction is underway with completion expected by the end of December 2023.

Environmental Compliance: Arbor Source and S&ME

Project Funding and the Plan for Future Ownership and Maintenance: As reported in previous updates, Verdae will fund the development of the Legacy Connector, with the understanding that the City of Greenville will assume ownership and maintenance of the public asset after the successful completion of the project.
