Grandma is happy to have the PICC line as it means she doesn't have to have any other needles to have blood tests or drugs.






Pip is an oncology nurse and she gives Grandma the chemo drugs through a special pump. Jade from theatre is keeping Grandma company.

Grandma needs a super hero to help make gingerbread men. Who could that be?




Chemo can make hair fail out and Grandma doesn't want to leave hair all over the house like Loki does, so she had it shaved off last time.

Grandma will wear beanies and hats to keep her head warm, and might even wear her old wig.




Last time Grandma's hair grew back silver! What colour do you think it will grow back this time? Maybe you could draw hair on Grandma in the colour you would like to see.



People having chemo can catch infections really easily, so Grandma will need to stay away from anyone who has a bug.


If you get a snotty nose, like Dadda here, you may not be able to see Grandma for a day or two.
