

Scope of Challenge and Opportunity

- The Highway 1 Safety and Mobility Studies created high level concept plans.
- The county is seeking funding for the Action Plan that transforms concepts into “shovel ready”, funded projects.
- The Midcoast communities should be involved in decision making about specifics for Highway 1 and trails in individual neighborhoods as well as the Midcoast as a whole.
- This is a process that must be managed and effectively communicated.
- The MCC will take responsibility for this public process.

Key Aspects of Public Participation

- MCC Core Responsibilities
 - Representing the residents of the Midcoast
 - LCP Alignment
- MCC Assuming Broader Citizen Stakeholder Responsibilities
 - Representing the citizens of San Mateo County who visit and use coastal facilities and natural resources
 - Linking with agencies
 - Connecting with business interests

- Working groups – each considered a committee
 - Highway 1 – Montara
 - Highway 1 – Moss Beach
 - Highway 1 – El Granada/Miramar
 - Coastal Trails
 - Trails and Alternate Transportation

Chartering the Committee

- Title: MCC Traffic and Trails Committee
- Purpose: Work with the Midcoast community, San Mateo County government, and other agencies, business interests and citizens to establish plans and projects for the Highway 1 roadway and other roads and trails
- Objectives: Maintain multiple working groups to address the range of projects and issues under consideration in the Highway 1 Action Plan. Insure there is appropriate coordination of objectives and detail plans across the specific projects.
- Time Frame: The committee will be a standing committee of the MCC
