Surfers' Beach –

Hwy 1 is the only way to cross the Montara Creek ravine separating Moss Beach and Montara at the Lighthouse.

West side:
Vegetation blocks access/visibility
for bikes, pedestrians.



2012 Caltrans left-turn project
has reduced bike/ped trail space.



South of 9th St, Montara, west side Highway 1 --
Plenty of level land for bikes & pedestrians
if vegetation were cleared from right-of-way

West side Hwy 1 at 9th St. Montara

No place to walk or bike.
No visibility for motorists,
bicyclists, or pedestrians.

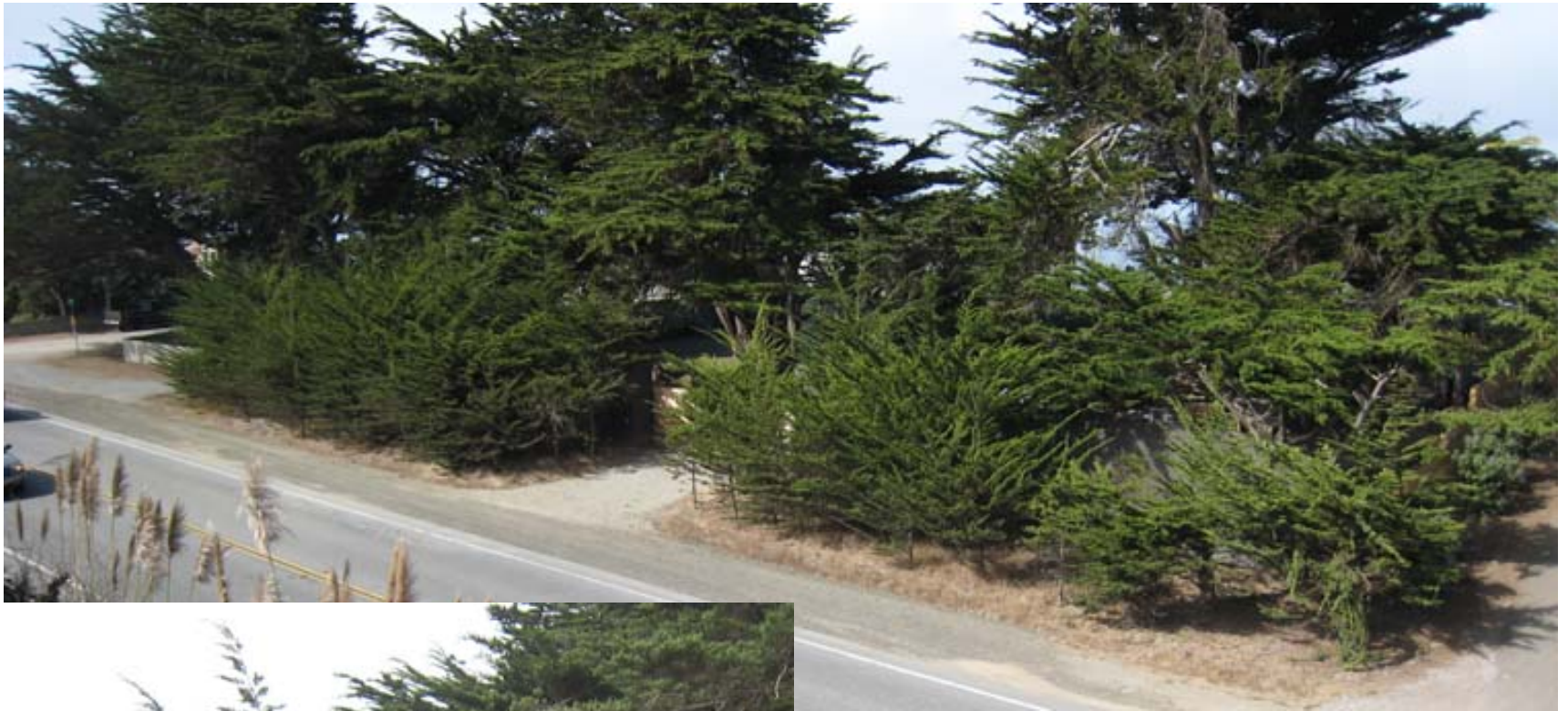




9th to 8th St. Montara, west side Highway 1 --
Bikes and pedestrians are crowded close to traffic
because of residential landscaping in right-of-way.



8th to 9th St, Montara, west side Highway 1 –
Plenty of level land for pedestrian trail
if residential landscaping were cleared from
right-of-way



8322 Cabrillo Hwy –
between 5th and Seacliff –
tall masonry walls where front
yard fence height limit is 4 feet.
Right-of-way is planted thick with
4 rows of Cypress trees occupying
any pedestrian trail space.
