MCC Committee Midcoast California Coastal Trail Report

- Recommend improvements to provide a safe street bicycle trail along the Airport St. and the Dardenelle Trail CCT segment.
- Consider the Jean Lauer Trail as the core of a braided segment for this area supporting bicycle and handicapped access.
