### Committees

 MCC Committees Governed by the MCC Bylaws County "Action" Committees (CAC) Sometimes called "Citizen" **Committees (misnomer)** • Driven by County Staff Community Committees Local Residents driven









### **Functions of Committees**

- Provide Awareness on issues affecting the MidCoast and gather public opinion.
- Provide resources and guidance to MidCoast Residents to work with the County on local issues through the MCC

 Enlist residents in identifying, researching and prioritizing issues to support the Council.









# MCC Committees

- MCC Bylaws Govern MCC Committees Article IV
- Section 4.04. Meetings And Actions Of Committees.
  - Meetings and actions of committees shall be governed in accordance with the requirements of the Community Council
  - Any committee reports shall be presented at one or <u>more</u> meetings of the Community Council
- Section 4.05. Committees Subject To Community Council Direction.
  - The Community Council and the Committee should adopt rules consistent with the Bylaws for the government of any committee.
  - The activities and affairs of all committees shall be conducted under the ultimate direction of the









### **Benefits of MCC Committees**

- Open, Transparent, Regularly Scheduled and Noticed Meetings with Minutes.
- Community participates at all stages of the Projects
- Provides a single, local clearing house on all MidCoast issues
- County doesn't have to micro-manage projects
- Committee must report back to Council at a Public Meeting

- GGNRA Trailheads, Dog Management and Fire Safety









### **County Action Committees**

- County Staff working with "special" interest groups on individual project.
- Rules Governing Meetings are not clear or published.
- Exclusive Committees not Inclusive
   Infringes on the MCC jurisdiction granted in SMC BoS Resolution 55042









# Benefits of CACs

- Can Provide County Resources (\$\$\$, Expertise, Manpower) to local projects
- Lend Weight to Local Positions when dealing with State, Federal or Private Organizations
- Can help raise awareness of future plans on the MidCoast but this is best done through the MCC.









### Short Comings of CACs

Lack Full Community Involvement
Lack Community Oversight
Lack of LCP as the guiding document for assessing projects on the Midcoast
Don't understand local issues
Causes Confusions for Residents and Agencies on MidCoast









### Examples of County Committees gone Bad

#### • MPAC – Quarry Park

- County Funding to El Granada without Community involvement.
- Seal Cove Drainage
  - Started as a road access issue and keeps morphing
- Perched Beach Admin Building on Beach
  - Doesn't the Coastal Act '76 apply here
- Big Wave Planning Dept's DEIR
  - County workers doing the work for private interest
- HWY 1 Mobility Steering Committee









# Citizen Driven Committee

 Residents outside of the County and the MCC Organize on an issue

MCC Committees vs. County "Action Committees"

• MCC is an elected representative body for the MidCoast and it's committees must work through the Council and provide an open and transparent process. County Staff is not elected • County Staff does not represent the **MidCoast** 

 County staff may not give proper weight to the Midcoast LCP

 County Staff does not have to abide by the Brown Act









### MCC Committees vs. County "Action Committees" (cont.)

- The MCC represents all the communities of the MidCoast and not any one single interest group.
  - County Staff maybe unaware of other community concerns or priorities.
  - Perpetuates the "squeaky wheel syndrome".
  - Piece wise actions make for poor planning.
  - LCP and Historical Context often lacking resulting in mismanaged consultants and wasted funding









### MCC Committees vs. County "Action Committees" (cont.)

- The MCC was elected by a 2-1 majority of the voters in 1991 to represents all the communities of the MidCoast to the County.
  - "a council to speak for them before the SMC BoS".
  - "The MCC will make sure the communities can finally get the counties undivided attention".
- No Council member has the right to undo the people's will.

- The MCC represents the entire community of the unincorporated Midcoast to any agency on Midcoast matters.

- The County needs to work with the MCC when conducting business on Midcoast.

- The MCC has a duty to see that the County's business in the Midcoast is conducted in an open and fair manor.
