







Notice of Fuels Reduction Work

The Coastside Fire Protection District (CFPD) is requiring POST to:

- Limb up all trees on Rancho Corral de Tierra from 0' to 30' from the property lines of the residences on San Carlos Avenue to 6' above ground level;
- Remove all standing dead trees from within 30' of the residences and thin dense stands to 100';
 - · Remove all dead shrubs and thin dense shrub cover; and
 - Create a 30' mowed firebreak adjacent to the property lines of the residences.

These actions will substantially reduce the fuel load adjacent to your residences, giving you an extra degree of protection this summer.



- 3.04.1.2 Vegetatipn. Weeds, grass, vines or other growth that is capable to siving lamited and editingering property, shall be cut down and removed by the owner or occupant of the premise.
