RE: Application by Seventh Wave Productions to hold an XTERRA Mountain Bike Triathlon in the El Granada area.

Dear Supervisor Gordon:

At the regular meeting of the Midcoast Community Council on May 9, 2001, we unanimously approved the application by Seventh Wave Productions (SWP) to hold another XTERRA mountain bike Triathlon race in the El Granada area with the following conditions:

- MCC Approval is contingent on the approval of Midcoast Park Lands if any par! of Quarry Park is directly impacted, or if Midcoast Park Lands owns the Mirada Surf easement which is included in the route.
- We request that Seventh Wave provide adequate course monitors at all intersections on the bike course to ensure the riders stay on the course and do not stray into Quarry Park.
- 3. We ask that they agree that the course will not be changed without a full arivisory to the MCC and Midcoast Park Lands. If there are issues regarding the Mirada Surf easement that cannot be resolved, an alternate route should be designated. The specific route presented to the Council by Seventh Wave is the only route approved by the Council at this time. Should the route change without notification and approval of Midcoast Farkiands and the MCC, the event should be cancelled.

We appreciate the efforts made by Seventh Wave to move the course onto private lands and minimize the traffic impact on the community. We are hopeful that the event will be a safe and successful one for participants and community members.
