Airport MasterPlan Review

The master plan for the Half Moon Bay Airport is being updated and a subcommittee of the MidCoast Community Council has prepared recommended additions and changes to the current document. The MCCC voted, on July 9, to accept some of the subcommitte's recommendations for presentation to the County. The next steps are these two public meetings:

UPCOMING MEETINGS: July 21 & 22

- Coastside -- Supervisors Richard Gordon and Mary Griffin will hear coastsiders' opinions on the plan at 7:00 pm Monday evening, July 21 at Cunha Middle School, Church and Kelly St in Half Moon Bay.
- **Redwood City** -- The full Board will vote on the plan the following day, Tuesday, July 22 in their regular 10 am session in Redwood City.

According to airport manager Gary Peterson, "once the Board determines which version or elements of the plans they will accept for study, the Environmental Review and documentation process will begin. This will take place over the next 9 to 12 months and will include public meetings, all of which will be advertised in the Half Moon Bay *Review*."

DOCUMENTS: The County had a draft master plan for the airport prepared by consultants. This draft, as possibly amended by the Board of Supervisors, will be the basis for the upcoming environmental review process. A copy of this base document is available at both the Half Moon Bay library and the airport office. Each of the subcommittee documents (available below) refer to this draft plan:

- <u>"Final comment" document</u>, prepared by the Airport Subcommittee, commenting on the draft proposal prepared by consultants to the County.
- <u>Alternative D</u> -- an alternative proposed by the Airport Subcommittee and accepted by a vote of the MCCC on July 9th for presentation to the Board of Supervisors with the request that it be included in the final study.
- <u>Alternative E</u> -- a second alternative prepared by subcommittee member Jim Washington. The subcommittee may incorporate this proposal into their final presentation to the Supervisors.
