PUBLIC COMMENT

Princeton Citizen's Advisory Committee announced Beach Clean-Up Day; Location of Democratic Party caucuses announced; Request for information on CalTrans plans for bike lanes; Farallone View PTA representative requested help for the Emergency Response Center.

CANDIDATES' FORUM

Meyers reported on behalf of Meyers and Brown who planned forum for Board of Supervisors Candidates forum slated for May 6th. Suggestions were made re: questions to be asked of candidates.

M/S/P Approved 6-0 expenditure of no more than \$75 for Candidates' forum.

M/S/P Approved 6-0 the questions to be asked, the structure of the forum and Meyer as moderator.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance Subcommittee

Marsh reported on Bernadette McAllister's offer to help with fund-raising. She has declined to help on anything but specific fund-raising events; anything else not cost-effective for her and her partner. Marsh and Bledsoe met with Supervisor Griffin - strategy is now to resubmit MCC budget as part of County 1992-93 budget review process.

Earth Day Liaison

Bledsoe scheduled MCC members' attendance at table; Ayers suggested selling "at cost" herbs at table as fund-raiser.

Facilities Subcommittee

Meyers reported that we have the County Public Works Yard reserved for MCC meetings during the summer.

Orvall & Cypress Streets Opening

Robert Sans, Director of Public Works explained his recommendation to the Board of Supervisors that the two streets be re-opened. MCC entertained comments from the public and asked questions of Mr. Sans.

M/S/P MCC to recommend that the County not re-open Orval and Cypress Streets to general traffic, but to pursue safety access only; and for plan to manage speed on Los Banos Avenue to be developed. Brown to communicate to Board of Supervisors.
