SURVEY CONDUCTED JANUARY 1991

There were approximately 1000 surveys distributed.

There were 5684 registered voters in the MidCoast on  
January 1, 1990.

There were 63 surveys returned.

That makes a 1% return of registered voters and 6.3% return  
of surveys distributed.

#3. What local issue(s) concern you most? Selected  
replies= Balanced growth not anti-growth, Diminishing of  
open space and density of development, Water,  
Uncontrolled development/growth, Offshore oil drilling and  
lack of enforcement of the Coastal Initiative, Schools,  
Too much hotel and hotel related development, Traffic,  
Sensible growth with preservation of the small rural  
community feeling, Formation of the Coastside Recreation  
District, Rapid population/tourist growth, Development of  
the harbor adverse to status as fishing port, Environment,  
Representation of community interest and concerns, Look at  
the benefits of annexation to HMB, Open space protection  
and mass transit, Traffic, Adequate representation, Road  
conditons, Avoiding absorption by HMB, Airport safety,  
Overbuilding with inadequate water, Unity on the  
coastside.
