The meeting opened with a review of the primary objective: Create a California Coastal Trail (CCT) map and conceptual plan notes to be reviewed by the public and appropriate agencies and then work with the county to present the plan to the Board of Supervisors for approval.

All members were given an opportunity to express their views on the California Coastal Trail and the particular segment under consideration. Carl May provided a background on the California Trail and provided several resources that are linked on the committee page. The committee acknowledged the previous work done on the definition of this CCT segment

In summary the committee acknowledged that there are multiple strands of the trail. The committee has a specific interest in identifying a walking trail that provides closest access to the shoreline. It was noted that beyond the effort to identify and document this trail segment, it is important to publicize the route so that it gains public recognition and support.

The committee followed a marked up route of the trail on Google Earth and made comments concerning the route and labeling. That result is reflected in the attached pictures. The pictures show also show the parallel trail as the path through downtown Montara. These pictures have been compiled by Len Erickson, but have not been formally reviewed by the full committee. That will occur at the next committee meeting which will occur in July.
