Half Moon Bay, CA – Many people in Half Moon Bay are asking these and other questions about one of the most timely and critical issues we face as a community:

- What does the future of housing look like in Half Moon Bay?
- What mix of housing options and programs will help our community to thrive?

The City of Half Moon Bay and Home for All San Mateo County are hosting an educational community conversation that will help us all gain a better understanding of the local housing situation. Participants will learn about the current housing situation in our community, share experiences and ideas, and explore how the community can work together to address Half Moon Bay's housing needs. People who are newer to the discussion about housing are particularly welcome at this community conversation. A mix of short presentations and small group discussions will help people from all backgrounds to be able to contribute their thoughts and perspectives.

Half Moon Bay applied for and was awarded a grant to pilot new approaches to community engagement on the topic of housing. The grant provides technical assistance from Home for All and consultant Common Knowledge Plus (www.ckgroup.org), as well as funds to help conduct engagement that is inclusive, informed, and sustained.
