
# Princeton Street-End Beach Access Improvements

Identify near-term coastal access priorities & concepts that fit within recently allocated funding of \$40,000.

Broadway viewing area improvements were allotted \$22,000 (2 benches, interpretive sign, move guardrail).





Princeton Ave. is the California Coastal Trail alignment (solid red line), with beach walking alternative west of Columbia (dashed red line).

Four short road stubs connect Princeton Ave. to the shoreline: West Point, Vassar, Columbia, & Broadway.

Beach is walkable west of Columbia at medium or low tide, but access is impeded by rip-rap at Vassar & Columbia.

Access improvement at Columbia would provide the most lateral beach trail benefit.

### Columbia beach access

- Steep eroding drop-off ending in jumble of rocks.
- Surface runoff erosion?
- Guard rail post undercut by erosion.





Beach at Columbia: significant bluff erosion 2016-2017

Alien rubble strewn over beach no longer provides erosion protection, but degrades view and beach use.




#### Columbia beach access

Plastic sand bags degrading on beach in jumble of rocks at bottom of access washout.

Wheel chair access is not practical at this location due to beach obstructions, especially boat ramp rails at former boatyard to the west.


















Soil berm and no guardrail at end Vassar – A cut through the berm at beach access point would shorten the vertical distance from street to beach.




GIS parcel map at Vassar

Vassar: 50 ft Ocean: 70 ft


R = ramp S = stairs (private)

No elevation rendering available to show ramp/dock high enough above the beach to walk under, and structures on the docks.






