As you know, this office represents the San Mateo County Planning Department and, from time to time, we are asked to assist in coordinating the County's response to requests from individuals and entities seeking licenses from the State Department of Beverage Control for certificates of public convenience and necessity. Specifically, in cases where a business operator seeks a license to serve or sell alcohol in a census tract where a certain threshold of such licenses has already been exceeded, the operator must receive from the local governmental agency with jurisdiction over the area in question a certificate that the public convenience or necessity would be served by issuance of such a license.

As reflected on the attached materials, Hop Dogma Brewing Co., LLC, seeks such a certificate from the County of San Mateo in connection with the proposed on-sale of beer and wine at a premises located at 30 Avenue Portola, Suite 1B, in El Granada. More particularly, Hop Dogma informs us that it plans to open a small production brewery with a separate wine and beer tasting bar and the entity provides correspondence, which I have attached, wherein it explains how the public necessity and convenience will be served by allowing sale of beer and wine on the premises.

As part of the process for consideration of such a request, the County seeks the recommendation of the Midcoast Community Council. Because of the relatively short period of time in which the County has to respond to this request, I am asking that you provide me with
