Council Year 2020 Summary

The priority issues are addressed with the Regular Agenda items and special meetings. This is a summary of 2020. COVID and Virtual Meetings had a major impact on the conduct of MCC business. An overview below is followed by an itemization of Regular Agenda activity for the 2020 year.

The 2020 year opened with the following expected priorities

At the beginning of the year San Mateo County brought in a consulting group (Common Knowledge) to augment outreach and orchestrate the coordination of the Cypress Point and Connect the Coastside projects. A pump track at Quarry Park commanded January attention with strong lobbying from the public.

In March/April the impact of COVID. disrupted standard patterns of operation:

- The MCC had to develop an operational style for virtual meetings.
- The type of outreach Common Knowledge was sponsoring was not possible and a survey and newsletter were the closeout projects of that program.
- Virtual meetings were required resulting in a period of adjustment and a public process for the Connect the Coastside which was not well received.
