MidPen does NOT believe high density housing is appropriate for Moss Beach.

The private owner of the 11-acre property bounded by Carlos Street, Sierra Street, and Lincoln Street in Moss Beach has put its property up for sale in the open market. The site has a land use designation for medium-high density residential, and has a prior approved entitlement from the 1980's for 148 homes.


MidPen does NOT intend to build 148 units on this site.

Instead, MidPen is committed to:

- 1. Community outreach and engagement to develop a better plan for the site;
- 2. Crafting a thoughtful proposal that is compatible with the surrounding neighborhood;
- Dedicating a significant portion of the site as permanent open space.
