Sometime in the deep dark days of the pandemic, down in the basement of our home in East York, Ted and Steven Mayoff—who have been friends and collaborators since the eighties, started to work together on a reimagining of *The Bacchae*. Having played Pentheus in a Stratford production decades ago, it was a project that Ted had been chatting to Steve about for a long time. I'll never forget the afternoon when Ted played me the first song from his computer. I knew right away that he and Steve had made something magical and wild that we were all in need of.

It will forever be one of the great creative joys of my life that the Coal Mine Theatre was able to wholeheartedly get behind the development of *DION: A Rock Opera*. It has taken an extreme amount of care, leadership and belief from Peter Hinton-Davis and Bob Foster and the commitment of many special artists who workshopped this piece with us over the last four years. It has taken the donations of many generous patrons and donors, one lucky grant from the Canada Arts Council and the support of the Slaight Family Foundation and our Board.

We welcome you to our very first World Premiere where we share what we love to explore most at the Coal Mine Theatre: what it means to be human.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Myths are stories that we know are not *real* but express or embody something that is *true*. They paradoxically embrace imagination and belief, rational circumstance and ecstatic experience. They are both simple and difficult and the very language of theatre.

DION is a contemporary rock opera exploring an ancient myth. It's a tragedy about the limits of reason, and the potential for disorder and revenge that lies inside the essential cry for freedom. Its story pits the emotional against the intellectual, the primal against the civilized, the animal against human and leads us to question what the healthy balance might be. Inspired by one of the oldest plays, *The Bacchae* by Euripides, *DION* reframes the myth of Dionysus for modern times. Dionysus is the god of wine and intoxication, their world evokes the glamor and grist of rock and roll: the sense of divine power and human aspiration, the followers and fans, groupies and grifters, prophets and politicians. I am reminded of how powerful the role music plays in moments of social upheaval, revolution and change.

The great rock operas of the 60's and 70's explored many of these Dionysian provocations – popular forms fused with cultural archetypes, creating something both subversive and grand. But rather than homage or nostalgia, Ted and Steve have fashioned a musical reclaiming of their own. Sometimes exposing our folly, at other times illuminating our full potential.

Jimi Hendrix (a Dionysian if there ever was one) said it best,

"When the power of love overcomes the love of power, the world will know peace."

SONG LIST AND PLOT SUMMARY

We are in the City State of Thebes.

THE WORD IS EVOE (Tiresias and Chorus)

Tiresias (he/she), a blind soothsayer who has lived as both a man and a woman, invokes and defines the concept of EVOE, an "exclamation of Bacchic frenzy."

THE SEDUCTION (Agave, Dion, Chorus)

A "man" approaches Agave, (she/her) the mother of Pentheus, ruler of Thebes. They question her and then reveal themself to be DION, (they/them) her nephew and a demi-god. They seduce her.

YOU CAN CALL ME DION (Dion, Chorus)

The Bacchants, a group of the outcasts of Theban Society who worship Dion, asks them to tell their story. Again!

EVOE 1 (Chorus and Agave)

The Chorus dance and sing

SOMETHING TO HOLD ON TO (Cadmus, Tiresias and Chorus)

Cadmus (he/him), father to Agave, grandfather to Dion and Pentheus, and former ruler of Thebes, laments the death of his other daughter Semele, Dion's mother. Tiresias, his old soothsayer and friend, joins him. They discuss joining the outcasts.

ALL HAIL PENTHEUS (Pentheus, Chorus)

Pentheus (he/him), ruler of Thebes, has been away. He is furious that so many people have joined the "cult" of Dion.

POISON TO WINE (Agave)

Agave wakes alone in the hills after a night of reveling.

WELCOME (Cadmus, Tiresias, Dion)

Dion welcomes Cadmus and Tiresias, who too are waking after quite a night in the hills.

REPRESENT (Dion, Chorus, Agave Cadmus Tiresias)

The protest song of the followers of Dion.

STORMING AND SURRENDERING (FULL COMPANY)

Pentheus' forces quell the rioters, and arrest Tiresias, who is led away in custody. Exactly as Dion planned....

STOP (Cadmus, Agave)

Father and daughter, among the ruins, try for a truce between them after all these years...

THE SINS (Cadmus, Agave and Chorus)

The chorus joins them as they reflect in their newfound understanding

TWEET, TWEET, TWEET (Pentheus)

In his War Room, Pentheus does what he does best

COME BACK TO THE FOLD (Pentheus, Tiresias)

The captured Tiresias is brought to Pentheus who tries to convince his old soothsayer to support him once again

EVOE 2 (Full Company)

Dion's followers take control of the War Room

NEMESIS (Pentheus, Dion, Chorus)

Dion steps forward, in disguise, to speak to Pentheus. Then they reveal themselves.

THE GREAT RECLAIMING (Tiresias, Chorus, Agave, Cadmus)

From prison, Tiresias sings of a vision that all throughout the land hear, joining in.

AFTER THE KISS (Pentheus, Dion, Chorus)

Dion works their magic on Pentheus, convincing him that the way to infiltrate the protestors is to disquise himself.

CLOSER TO HEAVEN (Dion, Chorus)

Dion and the chorus transform Pentheus

TWO SUNS (Pentheus, Dion, Chorus)

Pentheus emerges into the streets, transformed

THE RECKONING OF PENTHEUS (Chorus, Dion, Pentheus, Agave and Ensemble)

Pentheus stumbles into the frenzied followers, who include his mother Agave and grandfather Cadmus. They do not recognize him

SINS 2 (Agave, Cadmus, Ensemble)

Agave and Cadmus "come to" and realize what has happened.

MOMENT TO MOMENT (Dion, Ensemble)
