This was a new location for us. The fair was held outside as a drive through / walk through event. The weather was very wet, cold and windy. PACS provided our food boxes which include both perishable and nonperishable items. They donated 20,000 pounds of food. We had 30 boxes left over which we donated to the Middle School afterschool program. This drew our biggest numbers to date. The drive through option allowed us to move people through more quickly and safely. Crosswalk is a new partner for us. They are a service-oriented church who is interested in partnering with us much more in the future. We had all COVID safety markers in place with each attendee being temperature checked, questioned, hand washed and a mask



was required. Guests in vehicles were asked to remain in their vehicles during the whole event. Volunteers and nonprofit partners would visit with each vehicle as they looped around.

What would I do differently...?

1. Add arrow markers to signs so people know where to go.
2. Add weights to all tents. We lost a few tents due to wind. We had big water jugs on the corners, but they still blew away.
3. Have CSN staff wear CSN identifiers (maybe even just masks).
4. Add a few more take-home resources for guests (toiletries, dish soap, detergent, etc.).
5. Update the way we distribute resource packets during drive through events.
6. Intake shorter for volunteers. Pre intake done before they arrive.
7. Books – need to mark boxes better on both sides.
8. Check school wifi to see if we can use instead of mifi.
9. Interpretation – add language to volunteer intake.
10. Resource packets – pre plan.
11. Flyer in Vietnamese and Spanish.
12. Add while supplies last to flyer.
13. Broncos masks for all volunteers.
14. Google drive photos.
15. More hygiene kits.
16. Need new canopies.
