Castaway Cay, formerly known as Gorda Cay, is Disney Cruise Line's private island in the Bahamas. What makes it unique compared to other private cruise line islands is that it was the first to allow cruise ships to dock directly at the island, rather than tendering. Only 55 acres of the 1,000-acre island are developed, preserving much of its natural beauty. It's known for its family-friendly environment, themed activities, and Disney character appearances.

- Beaches and Areas: Features family-friendly beaches like Castaway Family Beach and the adult-only Serenity Bay, alongside Scuttle's Cove for children.
- Food and Drink Options: Various dining options are available, including barbecue stations, and Disney Cruise Line's drink packages are accepted.
- Upgraded Cost Areas: Cabanas are available for rent, offering a more exclusive beach experience, with prices starting from \$549 for a Family Beach Cabana.
- Unique Features: Character meet and greets, a 22-acre Snorkeling Lagoon, Pelican Plunge water slides, and historical landmarks like an airstrip used in movie productions.

- Snorkeling Lagoon: A large underwater exploration area with Disney character statues and hidden treasures.

Rated as one of the best private islands, Half Moon Cay has even earned the title "Best Private Island" 20 years in a row by Porthole Cruise Magazine.

- Beaches and Areas: The island boasts Half Moon Beach, a 2.5-mile-long stretch of soft, sandy beachfront, considered one of the best private island beaches.
- Food and Drink Options: Includes a complimentary barbecue lunch offering burgers, hot dogs, salads, and fresh fruit.
- Upgraded Cost Areas: Cabana rentals are available, offering shade and privacy on the beach.
- Unique Features: Captain Morgan's Pirate Ship, nature trails, birdwatching opportunities with over 45 different species, and an iconic "I Wish I Could Stay Here Forever" sign for photo opportunities.
